



I-17 Southbound: Coconino County Line - McConnell Bridge Pavement Rehabilitation

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation has initiated a pavement rehabilitation project along southbound Interstate 17, between McConnell Drive in Flagstaff and the Coconino County line (mileposts 311-340). Additional pavement improvements will occur on State Route 89A near milepost 402 and on northbound I-17 near Munds Park (milepost 323).

WHAT TO EXPECT

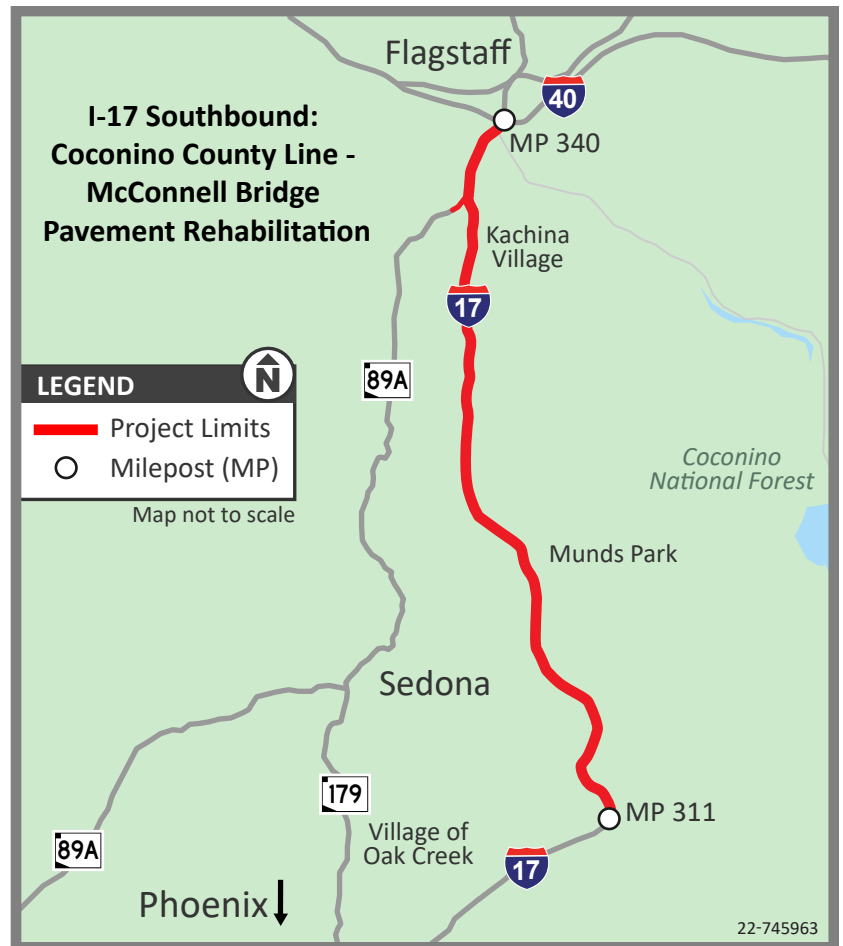
- ▶ Construction planned to start late spring 2022 and be completed summer 2024.
- ▶ Lane restrictions on the travel lanes (limited to two-mile segments at a time), ramps and bridges.
- ▶ Reduced speed limit through the work zone.

Nearby restrictions:

- ▶ Portions of State Route 89A between Flagstaff and Sedona are reduced to one lane only of alternating north- and southbound travel due to the SR 89A Oak Creek Canyon Improvements project currently underway. As a result, drivers may experience delays on SR 89A, if they should choose to use the roadway as an alternative route.
