

#### **Summary:**

FY 2012 RARF revenues amounted to \$324.2 million, an increase of 4.8 percent over FY 2011 and 0.8 percent above the estimate. June RARF collections totaled \$27.3 million, an increase of 0.9 percent over June 2011 and even with the estimate. FY 2012 RARF revenues posted modest year-over-year growth with strength centered in the **Retail Sales**, **Contracting** and **Restaurant and Bar** revenue categories. However, RARF collections over the last two months of FY 2012 posted significantly slower growth as Maricopa County consumers became more cautious due to the slowing national economy.

### **Highlights:**

- •The **Retail Sales** revenue category posted a year-over-year increase of 6.8 percent in FY 2012. This represents the strongest year-over-year growth since FY 2006. On June 14, 2012 the Arizona Department of Administration reported that the unemployment rate in Phoenix metropolitan decreased from 8.2 percent in May 2011 to 7.2 percent in May 2012, due mainly to an increase of 27,600 jobs during this period.
- •The **Contracting** revenues increased 8.9 percent over FY 2011. This is the first year since FY 2007 that the **Contracting** revenue category posted year-over-year growth. Maricopa County has experienced growth in new home permits which bodes well for **Contracting** revenues.
