### **HB 2123 license plate commission repeal**

The bill repeals the License Plate Commission and allows organizations that were previously approved for plates by the Commission to redesign their plate for an implementation fee. It allows for the general public to purchase organization plates previously approved by the Commission if the organizations allows for it by notifying ADOT through a written resolution.

### **HB 2133 motorcycle safety council**

Extends the statutory life of the Arizona Motorcycle Safety Advisory Council and continues the requirement for \$1 of each motorcycle registration fee to be deposited in the Motorcycle Safety Fund for six additional years, through June 30, 2016.

### **HB 2222 special license plate**

The list of special license plates authorized for vehicles registered in this state is expanded to include the Arizona Cardinals Football team and emergency medical services. For the Cardinal's special plate, the \$17 contribution portion of the \$25 annual registration fee is to be allocated to the Cardinal's Foundation. For the emergency medical services plate, the donation is to be used for public purposes related to emergency medical services. Also for the Gold Star family special plate already in statute, the donation is to be used for the construction and maintenance of the Enduring Freedom Memorial authorized for placement in Wesley Bolin Plaza rather than for the benefit of an immediate family member of a person who died while on active duty in the military.

### **HB 2224 mandatory vehicle insurance; financial responsibility**

The circumstances whereby a court may reduce or waive the penalty for driving without insurance are limited to cases where the person has purchased a six-month insurance policy and has not been cited for the same violation within the past 24 months or not more than once in the past 36 months. The authority previously granted to courts to suspend imposition of the penalty for 30 days to allow the person to purchase insurance is deleted.

### **HB 2306 authorized presence; licenses**

The law prohibiting the state and political subdivisions from granting a business license to any person who does not present documentation of proof of legal presence is modified to state that if a person has affirmatively established citizenship or non-expiring federal authorization, no further documentation is necessary upon application for renewal. Persons who hold a limited form of federal work authorization must re-present proper documentation upon application for renewal.

### **HB 2330 biodiesel fuel dispensers; labeling**

Biodiesel blends with less than 5% biodiesel are no longer exempt from labeling requirements for biodiesel fuel dispensers. Labeling must conform to federal regulations. Permits the label on a container of diesel fuel that contains less than 5% biodiesel to state "may contain up to 5% biodiesel." Also, transfer documents prepared by the seller of biodiesel blend for product that contains less than 5% biodiesel must notify the person to whom the product is transferred the volume percent of biodiesel intentionally added to the product.

### **HB 2388 STAN; repayment**

Municipalities that have received or will receive money from the Statewide Transportation Acceleration Needs (STAN) account as part of the Roads of Regional Significance Congestion Mitigation subaccount must repay the money within 15 years of receiving the money.

### **HB 2396 transportation; public-private partnerships**

Repeals, replaces and renames statutes dealing with transportation project privatization. New name for the chapter is Public-Private Partnerships in Transportation. Authorizes public-private partnerships to be used for any enhanced, upgraded or new transportation project. The private partner is permitted to collect tolls, and the government may enforce that collection. Stipulates procurement procedures and funding mechanisms for a public-private transportation project.

### **HB 2401 administrative rules oversight committee**

An Administrative Rules Oversight Committee is established, consisting of five members of the House of Representatives, five Senators, and the governor or designee. It is given oversight over all rules except those specifically exempted from the Administrative Procedures Act by statute. The committee sunsets on July 1, 2017. An intent section states the committee may review any rule or agency practice alleged to constitute a rule for "conformity with statute and legislative intent."

### **HB2425 state treasurer; management fees**

The maximum management fee the State Treasurer is authorized to charge investment pools that deposit money with it is halved to 6 basis points (0.06%) from 12 basis points. Proceeds are to be used to offset legislative appropriations for the Treasurer's Office rather than deposited in the General Fund.

### **HB 2426 enhanced driver licenses; prohibition**

The state is prohibited from implementing an enhanced driver license program as part of the federal Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative or the REAL ID Act of 2005. The Dept of Transportation is required to report to the Governor and Legislature any attempt by the U.S. Dept of Homeland Security to secure state participation in either enhanced license program.

### **HB 2480 regional transportation authority; qualifying counties**

Counties with a population of between 200,000 and 400,000 are permitted to form a transportation authority with the power to levy an excise tax and bond for projects.

### **HB 2482 civil air patrol; federal monies**

The civil air patrol is authorized to receive monies, either directly or indirectly, from the U.S. Dept of Homeland Security.

### **HB 2530 reckless driving; prior convictions**

The 24-month period within which a prior conviction for reckless driving will result in enhanced penalties for the instant violation is determined by the dates of the commission of the offenses irrespective of the sequence in which the offenses may have been committed.

### **SB 1003 driving under the influence; methadone**

SB 1003 specifies that persons who drive or are in actual physical control of a vehicle while using prescribed methadone are not guilty of driving under the influence (DUI) as long as they are not otherwise impaired.

### **SB 1073 population thresholds; counties**

The population thresholds that differentiate counties in terms of statutory authority to perform certain functions or to engage in certain activities are changed. Increases the current population threshold for a county to reach in order to receive 25% of County HURF allocation from 400,000 – 1,200,000 to 800,000 – 1,500,000.

### **SB 1113 restaurants; handguns; posting**

Concealed weapons permit (CCW) holders may carry concealed handguns into bars and restaurants that sell liquor for on-site consumption, although it is class 3 (lowest) misdemeanor for that person to consume alcohol while on the premises. The restaurant/bar owner may prohibit firearms on the premises by posting a sign to that effect. The Dept of Liquor Licenses must prepare the signs according to specified requirements and make them available to licensees at no cost. Also, a member of a sheriff's volunteer posse may be authorized to carry concealed weapons while on duty without a permit if the person has completed firearms training approved by the Arizona Peace Officers Standards and Training Board. A person who has honorably served a Minimum of 10 years as a law enforcement officer anywhere in this country may carry a concealed weapon in the state without a permit.

### **SB 1151 convenience fee; definition**

The list of credit card transactions on which the state may levy a convenience fee is expanded to include a voice response portal in addition to an Internet portal.

### **SB 1168 storage; firearms; motor vehicle**

A property owner or business entity is prohibited from enforcing a policy or rule that does not permit a person to carry firearms in his/her vehicle as long as the vehicle is locked (or the storage location of the firearm is locked) and the firearm is not visible from the outside. This prohibition does not apply if the vehicle is owned by a government entity or by the person's private employer if the owner of the vehicle does not consent to the transportation of the firearm. Includes certain other circumstances under which the prohibition does not apply, for example if the property owner provides temporary and secure firearm storage or a parking facility that is secured by a locked fence or if the property is owned by a defense contractor and the property is located on a military base.

### **SB 1169 vehicle impoundment administrative towing fund**

The list of requirements for a person to operate a towing truck is expanded to include obtaining a bond. The abandoned vehicle report that MVD requires of a person who has custody of a vehicle which has been towed from public property on order of law enforcement, and that has been held for 10 days, and without a claim being registered for the vehicle, the abandoned vehicle report must be filed electronically.

Administrative charges collected when a vehicle is towed or immobilized by the Capitol Police are deposited in a special fund to be used by the Capitol Police for law enforcement purposes. Retroactive to Jan. 1, 2008.

### **SB 1180 towing companies; release of vehicles**

Various requirements are placed on a towing company related to the release of a vehicle from its impound lot, including that the company may not charge a person for access to personal property within the vehicle if done during business hours and it must provide a detailed written statement of all charges. Towing operators must notify the driver of a vehicle being towed that was disabled due to an accident that any repair shop may be chosen and must disclose any commonality of ownership between the towing company and a repair shop. Further, a towing company may not remove a vehicle from its lot without prior permission of the vehicle owner or insurance company.

### **SB 1182 state treasurer; warrant notes**

Permits the State Treasurer to sell warrant notes without divesting from obligations related to the Highway Expansion and Extension Loan Program monies in the Budget Stabilization Fund or operating monies invested in securities that are earning a rate of interest greater than the cost of issuing warrant notes.

### **SB 1293 certificates of title; electronic system**

Effective June 1, 2010, the limitations in the number of lending institutions and sales finance companies that may participate in the electronic certificate of title system are deleted.

### **SB 1303 Open Meeting Law: Minutes: Notice**

For a municipality with a population greater than 2,500, the posting to the entity's Internet website as required by the state's open meeting law as to the official minutes or summary of legal actions taken by the governing body or an advisory or subcommittee must remain on the website for a minimum of one year. The 24-hour public notice period required for meetings of public bodies may include Saturday if certain conditions are met but does not include Sundays or official state holidays. Also charter school governing board meetings are specifically included in the requirement that public bodies must file a statement with the Secretary of State identifying where their meeting notices will be posted. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

### **SB 1320 ADOT: OMNIBUS**

1. Updates and reorganizes current HOV lane statutes.
2. Codifies Low Emission Energy Efficient Vehicles (LEEEV, also known as hybrid vehicles) standards in statute.
3. Makes changes to laws pertaining to minimum speed limits on highways for implements of husbandry and exempts implements of husbandry from impoundment if driven by nonlicensed persons. Defines “farm” for this purpose.
4. Amends current law to include dishonored electronic payments to the fees the Department may charge. Currently, the statute only addresses checks and money orders.
5. Updates commercial motor vehicle and equipment sections in Title 28 to reflect changes to federal rules.
6. Allows staggered license renewal dates for manufacturer licenses.
7. Changes the date that a manufacturer’s delinquent fee and penalty is due from December 1 to January 1.
8. Allows Title Service Companies to prepare or submit fuel tax reports on behalf of licensed motor carriers.
9. Clarifies bonding requirements and adds language to allow the State to accept a “cash” bond in lieu of a surety bond. Adds language to require a bond if the carrier does not have a “good standing status” from another International Registration Plan (IRP) or International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) jurisdiction.
10. Allows the Department to establish a state certified rest area program.
11. Allows the Director to establish a sponsorship program for Rest Areas.
12. Requires a city or town to repay monies received from a subaccount of the Statewide Transportation Acceleration Needs Account within 15 years after receiving the loan.
13. A city or town may construct, operate and finance the construction of toll roads within the corporate limits of the city or town.
14. Modify Arizona’s design build and construction-manager-at-risk statutes to make Arizona eligible for available American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funding.
15. Makes a technical correction regarding the definition of photo enforcement system.
16. Exempts a first responder while in the line of duty from any enforcement action or measure resulting from a photo enforcement action.

SB 1320 also included the following bills:

- HB 2010 license plate display; penalty (Knoponicki) - Modifies the penalty for obscuring this state’s name to a secondary civil violation and establishes a civil penalty of \$30 for this violation. Creates a penalty of \$100 if a second violation takes place within twelve months of the first violation.
- HB 2129 state aviation fund; grants (Rep. Jerry Weiers) - Changes the formula for determining the amount available for grants in the State Aviation Fund by

Specifying that the total amount of grant monies available in any fiscal year shall be based on the average annual revenue received for the past three years.

- HB 2222 special license plates (Rep. Tobin) - Establishes the *Arizona Professional Football Club* (APFC) and the *Emergency Medical Services* (EMS) special license plate if a charitable organization pays \$32,000 (each) to ADOT for implementation.
- HB 2234 trailer registration; VLT (Rep. Jerry Weiers) - Allows non-commercial trailers between six and ten thousand pounds gross vehicle weight (GVW) to pay a one-time registration fee for permanent registration and a one-time VLT. This makes these trailers consistent with other trailer weights that can permanently register.
- HB 2252 international ports development (Rep. Jones) - creates a new chapter in statute for AIDA. Provides direction for AIDA and allows it to receive appropriated funds from the Legislature, as well as from other public and private sources. Transfers administrative and support responsibilities from ADOC to the Department of Transportation.
- HB 2257 public transportation vehicles; stopping (Rep. Williams) - allows local authorities to establish public transportation stops on state highways or routes if the speed limit does not exceed fifty-five miles per hour.
- HB 2388 school crossings; signs (Rep. Biggs) - provides guidance for the wording to be used on portable signs at school crossings.
- HB 2395 ADOT; rules; compact repeal (Rep. Biggs) – Removes antiquated statutes and rule requirements as recommended by recent Auditor General Report.
- HB 2481 Joint legislative committee; transportation; Mexico (Rep. Jones) - establishes the Joint Legislative Review Committee on Transportation between Sonora, Mexico and Arizona Committee).
- HB 2530 reckless driving; prior convictions (Rep. Ash) - Clarifies that the dates of the commission of multiple offenses of reckless driving, irrespective of when the offenses were committed, must be the determining factor when considering if they were committed within a 24 month period for the purposes of sentencing.
- HB 2390 escort vehicles; training (Rep. Biggs) - requires that escort vehicle operators have at least four hours of certified traffic control techniques training.
- HB 2392 vehicles and loads (Rep. Biggs) - allows heavy duty vehicles equipped with idle reduction technology (IRT) to exceed the gross per-axle or axle group weight limit by no more than four hundred pounds.

**SB 1017 multiple sclerosis awareness special plates** SB 1017 creates the Multiple Sclerosis Awareness special license plate and Fund, the Arizona Masonic Fraternity special license plate and Fund, Hunger Relief special license plate and Fund and the Childhood Cancer Research special license plate and Childhood Cancer and Rare Childhood Disease Research Fund.

**SB 1022 political signs; tampering**

Prohibits the removal of political signs that support or oppose candidates for public office or ballot measures from public rights-of-way if certain placement conditions are met.
