Lane Reduction Proposed in Newly Approved Apache Junction Transportation Plan

A transportation plan for adding sidewalks, bicycle lanes and equestrian paths has been approved by members of the Apache Junction City Council with some reservations.

The council voted unanimously Jan. 15 to approve the plan, but two council members said when voting that they were concerned with a proposal to reduce the number of lanes on Superstition Boulevard from two to one in each direction.

"Well, I'm going to say overall I'm all for it and I'm going to say yes, but with the exception of the Superstition roadway. If I can do a half-negative and half-positive," Vice Mayor Chip Wilson said when voting.

"Same as Chip. Yes, leave Superstition at five lanes," Mayor Jeff Serdy said when voting.

City Attorney Joel Stern said it is a 7-0 vote in favor.

"I think the comments that were made during the vote I think are just considered comments because it wasn't part of the motion, it wasn't part of a motion to amend. So I would say it would pass," he said.

Dean Chambers of J2, the consultant who prepared the plan, said Superstition Boulevard traffic counts from May were used, showing 6,000 vehicles a day. He proposed striping be used to show the single lane in each direction.

"In the winter time, Superstition gets a lot more traffic than what happens in the May time frame," Vice Mayor Wilson said during the meeting.

"I have received a lot of complaints from people who have problems getting out of the post office because of the traffic — during the wintertime only. During summertime, if you wait three cars it's unusual. But during the wintertime, it's a lot more heavier traffic so I'm very concerned about the idea of decreasing that down to basically two lanes with a center turn." he said.

A recommendation to approve the active transportation plan was made in a 12-1 vote Jan. 8 at a joint meeting of the Apache Junction Parks and Recreation Commission and Apache Junction Planning and Zoning Commission. The dissenting vote was cast by Parks Commissioner Luciano Buzzin, who said during discussion that bike lanes should be 6 feet wide to accommodate three-wheel bikes and the speed limit on Apache Trail should be lowered to 25 mph. He also asked that bike lanes be added to Baseline Road in the first five years of the plan instead of a proposed five-10 years.

The plan creates the framework for the city to become more bicycling, walking and horseback riding friendly for both recreational users and for those who rely on modes of transportation other than the automobile. When completed, it would add 52 miles of sidewalk retro fit, 143 miles of bike lanes, 11 miles of multi-use and back-country trails (unpaved), 14 trailheads and 160 miles of multi-use paved pathways.•





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Design Completed for American Indian Veterans Memorial in Phoenix

SPS+ Architects recently completed conceptual design for the American Indian Veterans Memorial. The Memorial, a unique interpretive landscape design, is proposed to be located at Steele Indian School Park in Central Phoenix. The site is west of the water pond and north of the historic Indian School buildings.

Steele Indian School Park is located within the central core of downtown Phoenix. Nestled in a diverse neighborhood, the park serves as a place for recreation and public activities. Its purpose, as originally planned, has been to provide an open, green space within the cultural and historic context

of place. This is a place that has untouched beginnings yet lasting memories to many. It is here the Memorial will co-exist with its surroundings, bridging history with the timelessness of urban renewal, and where indigenous tribes continue to offer a sacred voice.

The Memorial's design not only captures the essence and spirit of the project itself but blends many conversations, from City of Phoenix representatives, Tribal veterans family members, and many Tribal Nations who have supported this journey for two decades. Kent Ware, Vice President with American Indian Veterans Memorial Organization explains, "The memorial will honor all American Indian Veterans."

The design team at SPS+ Architects understood that the sacred eagle plays a critical role in the story behind the American Indian Veterans Memorial. The eagle symbolizes freedom, spirituality, mystery, and journey – and therefore becomes a leading concept associated with reflection and remembrance.

The Memorial will integrate into the landscape seamlessly with its well-considered design. Richard K Begay Jr., AIA, Associate & Lead Designer at SPS+ Architects states, "Arriving at processional stairs, visitors will be greeted by two upright steel structures, which artistically express an eagle's wings - they 'Carry the Spirit of the Warrior' from day to night. As a cycle that never stops, therefore, the memory of the American Indian Veteran will be lasting and forever."

CCC Construction Tech Management Students Learn On Real-World Project

Architectural plans. Permits. Total lumber board feet. Drywall. Labor costs. Upgrading to 240-volt electrical systems. Everything needed must be thought of and accounted for.

Estimating the cost of a construction project is a good exercise for students in Coconino Community College's Construction Technology Management program – particularly if the project pertains to something in the real world.

That's exactly what the students got to experience recently, and their work helped CCC secure a grant for nearly \$1 million from the Del E. Webb Foundation.

The students, enrolled in the CTM 288 Construction Supervision class last semester, helped CCC estimate a budget for a major upgrade of the CTM facility and the cost of equipment to strengthen and create in-demand CTM programs at the Fourth Street campus.

"I think it's important for students to have the practical hands-on experience along with the classroom experience to fully understand what we are trying to teach them," said Ken Myers, CTM faculty. "The more they experience real-life scenarios, the better prepared they will be when they enter the workforce."

Dr. David Cain, CTM faculty who led CTM 288 class, said the students' estimate was checked by a local contractor, and the two estimates were virtually identical.

"It was fun," Cain said. "It was a good experience, and we even put the students' names on the proposal."

CTM 288 student William Gonzales said he appreciated the fact that the Del E. Webb project was the most realistic project he has accomplished to date in any of his core classes.

The students met with local contractors, learned their estimating process and went from there, using computer software, to help build a budget for the Del E. Webb project.

"It's amazing for our later, or future careers, or whatever we want to pursue," Gonzales said. Gonzales works as a maintenance technician at the Village at
Aspen Place. He said his career
opportunities opened up to him
after completing CCC's Certified
Apartment Maintenance
Technician program. He
continues to attend class to
improve his skills and is working
toward an associate degree in
Construction Technology.

"The company I work for now wants to see a lot of professional growth," Gonzales said. "It's nice to see a company appreciate that."

The total project budget is \$1,058,500, with \$997,500 coming from the Del E. Webb Foundation, and \$60,950 coming from CCC.

Did you know?

DBEs Must Perform a CUF for Credit Toward Project Goals

To credit a DBE subcontractor towards a project's DBE goal, the DBE must perform a Commercially Useful Function (CUF) on the project. A DBE performs a CUF when it is responsible for execution of their work and carries out its responsibilities by actually performing, managing, and supervising their work. ADOT uses a variety of tools to maintain the integrity of the DBE program and to ensure that DBE firms are not limited to the role of an extra participant or used as a pass-through on a project by the prime contractor.

ADOT Bid openings after January 1st, 2017 will require prime contractors to submit DBE affidavits within 5 calendar days from bid opening. This is two days less than the current requirement. For example, if bid opens on Friday, the DBE Affidavits will be due to BECO, from the prime contractor, by Wednesday before 4:00 PM. Therefore, this is reducing the time DBEs and prime contractors have to prepare, sign and submit the DBE Affidavits to BECO. DBEs are urged to consider this new time restriction when working with prime contractors to complete and sign the DBE Affidavits in order for them to be submitted to BECO by the 5th calendar day from bid opening.


