#### Introduction

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), the City of San Luis, Cuidad de San Luis Rio Colorado in conjunction with Federal Highway Administration (FWHA) and ADOT's Office of International Affairs have worked together to actively involve the public throughout the course of this study to address the most critical current and future transportation needs for the cities of San Luis, Arizona and San Luis Rio Colorado, Sonora, Mexico.

#### **Public Meetings**

#### **Public Notice**

The public was notified of the meetings through multiple methods:

- Notices were published in two newspapers, Yuma Sun and Bajo el Sol in Spanish.
- An email bulletin was distributed to area media, stakeholders and elected officials.
- The meeting notice was also posted on the study website: azdot.gov/SLbinationalstudy

#### **Meeting Format, Materials and Presentation**

The first public meeting was focused on informing the public about the study and soliciting public comments. The goal for the second public meeting was to inform the public of the study findings, including deficiencies and recommendations. Both meetings were held inside the council chambers and consisted of brief presentations with an open house format afterwards in an effort to allow the public to review maps, ask questions and speak with study team members one-on-one. The meetings were both conducted in English with a Spanish translator available for members of the public who chose to listen via headphones.

Approximately 25 people attended the first public meeting and approximately 15 people attended the second public meeting. Most public comments included paving roads, adding sidewalks and bicycle and pedestrian improvements in the downtown area. Below is the comment transcription for the second public meeting.


- Determined if the current and planned infrastructure are properly serving the community and regional travelers.




