Public Records Request Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I need to fill out a form to make a request?

A: No. However, to ensure that all requested information is provided, and to quickly and accurately produce the requested records, we recommend use of the form.

Q: What information is beneficial in the Description of the request form?:

A: Identification of specific records and time frame is beneficial and is likely to result in a more prompt response.

Helpful Information and Resources:

- 1. Specialized records or reports are not created to respond to public record requests. Agency records created and maintained for state operations are public records.

 - ADOT and MVD are regulated by the Federal Driver's Privacy Protection Act (or DPPA, 18 U.S.C. 2721-2725 and Title 28, Chapter 2, Article 5 of the Arizona Revised Statutes. It is the responsibility of the individual or entity making a request to gain knowledge of all federal and state laws which govern access to and use of MVD records and to determine eligibility under these laws, including list of permissible uses.
- 3. ADOT Traffic Operation Center traffic cameras: ADOT does not record from highway cameras, which are used for live-traffic monitoring by ADOT personnel.
- 4. Traffic signal cameras: ADOT traffic signals cameras are for monitoring traffic flow. ADOT traffic signal cameras do not record.
- 5. ADOT custodian of records cannot analyze records as they are not the subject matter experts. General analysis of engineering records may be obtained from independent industry roadway engineers.

Q: How long will it take to get the information I'm requesting?

A: ADOT makes every effort to respond to requests as quickly as possible. Requests are processed in the order they are received. Your request is a priority for our staff, and we will respond as promptly and accurately as possible.



Q: Are all records public record?

A: Most state agency records are public records subject to release. However, there are some records that are expressly designated as non-public records or exempt form Title 39 disclosure by law. Additionally, state agencies may redact or withhold certain information or records for reasons of privacy, confidentiality or the state's best interests.

As custodians of confidential information we are obligated to protect such information as:

- Social Security numbers
- Dates of birth
- Medical Records
- Any other personal identifiers
- As required under Federal Driver's Privacy and Protection Act and ARS Title 28

Q: Can I come and inspect documents?

A: Yes. Records are open to inspection during regular business hours. You must specifically request to inspect records at the time of submitting public request. The Custodian of Records will coordinate a meeting with you as soon as practical. It is prohibited to alter or remove contents of any record file. You may take notes, photograph, personally scan or flag pages to be copied. You will be notified of the cost for copies once they have been made.

Q: What are the fees for public record and when is payment due?

A. You will be notified in advance of the fees to produce the records and payment must be made in advance. See Public Record Fee Schedule on this website. We do not accept debit or credit cards.
