



SR 79: Fannin-McFarland to Jason Lopez Circle Pavement Rehabilitation

PROJECT FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation initiated in July 2024 a pavement rehabilitation project on State Route 79 from the Fannin-McFarland Aqueduct at milepost 132 (north of Salazar Street) and Jason Lopez Circle at milepost 135 in the town of Florence. This project seeks to maintain the structural integrity and extend the life of the pavement.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- ▶ Adding raised pavement markings and rumble strips.
- ▶ Removing and replace the old friction course.
- ▶ Implementing pavement spot repairs.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

- ▶ Construction is expected to take three months to complete.
- ▶ Work will be completed overnight from 8 p.m. Sunday, July 21, to 8 a.m. Friday, July 26, after that work is scheduled from 5 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

WHAT TO EXPECT

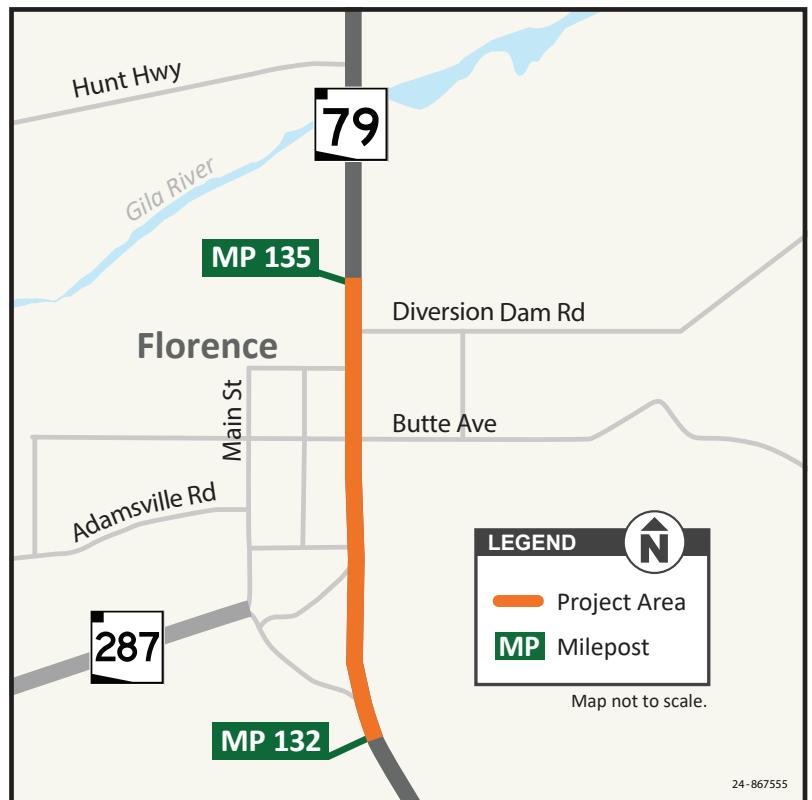
- ▶ A 12-ft width restriction.
- ▶ The speed limit will be reduced to 25 mph.
- ▶ A flagging operation will be used to help drivers navigate the area.
- ▶ ADOT will provide advance notice of restrictions and closures to email subscribers and on the project traffic alert web page.
