1. INTRODUCTION

Adopting electric vehicles (EVs) reduces traffic noise, ozone formation, carbon monoxide, and carbon dioxide and particulate emissions, which have negative impacts on people and the environment. As more Arizonans and visitors to the state are driving EVs, the state is working to incorporate federal funding opportunities into development of infrastructure needed to support EV drivers. The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), utilizing funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program, has developed Arizona's EV Infrastructure Deployment Plan (Plan), which seeks to foster EV adoption and long-range mobility by reducing gaps in electric vehicle supply equipment infrastructure (EVSE; i.e., an EV charging station) while contributing to an equitable, reliable, resilient, and accessible national EVSE network.

The development of the 2022 Deployment Plan (2022 Plan) commenced in May 2022 and was approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in September 2022. The subsequent 2023 Deployment Plan (2023 Plan) was based on finalized NEVI Formula Program Guidance and the NEVI Standards and Requirements (23 CFR Part 680) released in February 2023. This updated 2024 Deployment Plan (2024 Plan) incorporates newly proposed Alternative Fuel Corridors (AFCs).

2. PUBLIC MEETING

To share progress and gather input on the 2024 Plan, ADOT hosted a statewide virtual public meeting on July 10, 2024. The meeting was held via the Zoom online meeting platform and was attended by 264 people. The meeting consisted of a presentation followed by a question-and-answer (Q&A) session between the public and a panel of technical and public engagement staff working on the Plan. ADOT provided live interpretation in Spanish and in Diné (Navajo) and allowed participants to call in to the meeting, rather than only join by Zoom, to facilitate access for residents who do not have reliable internet service. The interpreters also read the Title VI Nondiscrimination Notice to the Public slide, as well as the slide on how to take the self-ID survey, in Spanish and Diné to all attendees.

The purpose of the meeting was to share information about the 2024 Plan update, including a review of the NEVI program and ADOT's role in administration and implementation and an update of the status of 2022 Plan implementation. The meeting addressed the new routes and stations proposed in the 2024 Plan, as well as routes to potentially be added in future updates, based on both technical analysis and input from the public and key stakeholders.

Three project team members from ADOT served as panelists at the meeting:

The question-and-answer session followed the presentation. Attendees online were able to submit their questions through the Zoom Q&A feature, while a portion of the session was set aside to receive questions and comments verbally from attendees joining by phone. Participants entered 152 questions and comments into the Q&A feature. Questions on similar topics were aggregated, with 76 questions verbally answered by the panelists.

2.1. PUBLIC MEETING NOTIFICATION

The July 10, 2024, virtual public meeting was publicized through the ADOT project website, ADOT GovDelivery email alerts, print ads, ADOT social media posts and a news release.

2.1.1. Project Website

The project website is intended to increase accessibility by serving as a resource that provides a project overview, including information about the 2022 Plan, the 2023 Plan update and the 2024 Plan update along with meeting presentations and recordings. 2.1.2. GovDelivery Emails

Information on how to participate in the virtual public meeting and provide comments on the 2024 Plan update were distributed by ADOT on June 19, June 26, July 8, July 9 and July 15, 2024, to the EV subscriber list in GovDelivery. Each notice included over 4,300 contacts and on average had a 42 percent open rate.

2.1.3. News Release

ADOT Public Information staff distributed two news releases to media outlets on June 19, 2024, and July 8, 2024.

2.1.4. Social Media

ADOT Digital Communications staff posted to ADOT's Facebook, Twitter and NextDoor accounts multiple times between June 19 and July 14, 2024, providing information about the public meeting and commenting opportunities. During the commenting period, the EV-specific posts garnered 795,258 social media impressions.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

This section summarizes the comments received during the public-comment period from July 10, 2024, through July 17, 2024. Comments could be submitted through mail, telephone, email and online.

A total of 284 comments were submitted. The public comments and questions are included in **Appendix E**.

3.1. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Comments and questions received during the public comment period and at the virtual public meeting addressed the following topics:

- **Charging Technology**—Recent announcements in the EV industry about charging connector standards; the potential for installing chargers with higher wattages than 150 kilowatts (kW); charging compatibility with vehicles that use different connector types; impacts of extreme heat on vehicles and charging infrastructure
- **Station Features and Amenities**—Potential for charging larger EVs such as medium- and heavy-duty trucks and buses at planned stations; inclusion of the network in charging station locator apps and maps; inclusion of shade structures and pull-through charging at stations; placing stations at locations with food and drink options and restrooms
- **Station Operations**—Charging prices and the ability to regulate prices; station maintenance and the ability to ensure minimal station downtime, particularly during holidays and peak travel days/times; power availability and impacts to the electrical grid; safety considerations, including fire prevention, electrical hazards, and the security of equipment and of users
- **Planning and Implementation**—Timeline for station construction and charger installation; number of chargers and stations ADOT anticipates can be funded through NEVI; consideration of local and wider environmental impacts
- **Stakeholder and Public Engagement**—Public involvement in the planning process; stakeholder, government, and agency coordination; coordination with neighboring states; suggestions for partnering with various businesses and industries for station hosting

4. TITLE VI REPORTING

4.1. Self ID Surveys

Meeting participants were asked to complete ADOT's self-identification survey for Title VI reporting purposes. A total of 89 people completed the self-ID survey. Of the 89 self-identification survey responses, 87 identified as White, five participants identified as Hispanic/Latino, two identified as African American/Black, three identified as Asian, and two identified as American Indian/Alaskan Native. Some survey responses included multiple selections.

4.2. Title VI Meeting Summary

A Title VI public meeting summary documenting ADOT's compliance with Title VI and Title II nondiscrimination and accommodations was submitted to the Civil Rights Office on July 24, 2024.

National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program Overview

- \$5 billion available to states under the NEVI program to fund publicly accessible EV chargers along Alternative Fuel Corridors (AFC).
- Arizona is eligible for up to \$76.5 million of this funding across five years.
- This federal funding can only be used as directed: the construction or upgrade of EV fast charging stations along designated roads.



NEVI Requirements

- NEVI requires states to develop a plan for EV fast chargers and to update it annually for the duration of the NEVI program (until 2025).
- Stations must be placed no more than 50 miles apart; exceptions are allowed where no suitable locations exist.
- Stations must be located within one mile of the highway.
- At least four 150-kilowatt CCS direct current fast chargers must be provided at each charging station.



A Note About Connectors

- The NEVI program requires that each station be equipped with four charging ports with Combined Charging System (CCS) connectors (SAE J1772)
- It also allows for the installation of additional types of connectors, including but not limited to the North American Charging Standard (or SAE J3400, NACS which were formerly known as the Tesla connectors)
- ADOT is planning to include CCS & NACS connectors as part of our next advertisement.

Justice 40

- In terms of equity, NEVI requires that states meet the goals of the federal Justice 40 program.
- 40% of the program's benefits of implementing our EV plan must be targeted toward disadvantaged communities, including rural and tribal areas.



EV Station Ownership & Funding

- Stations in Arizona will be privately owned, constructed, maintained and operated.
- State funding will not be used to build stations in Arizona; 80% of funding will be federal, with 20% covered by the awarded private sector contractor.





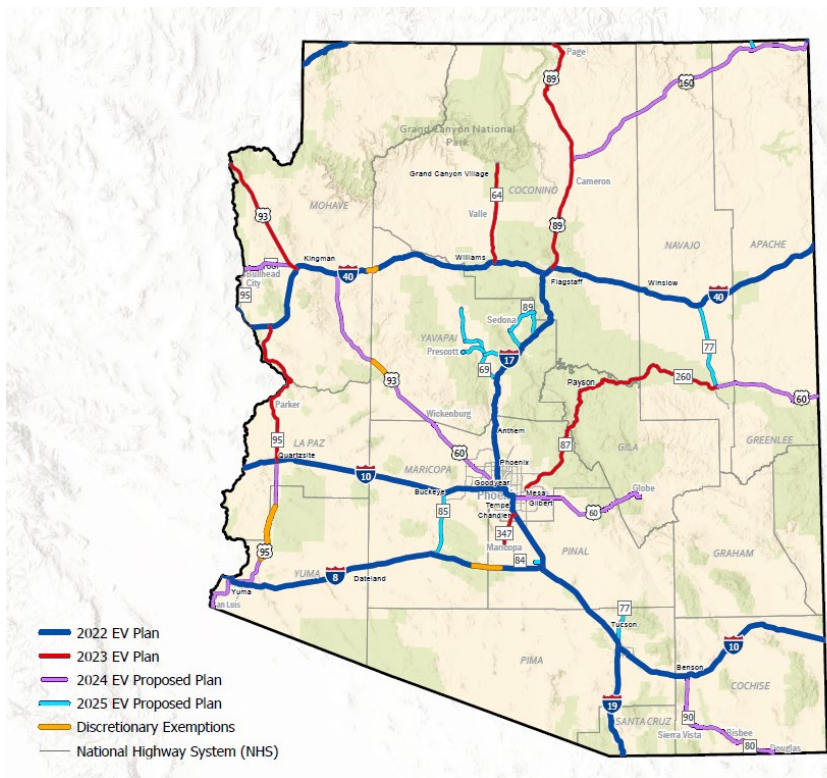

- The Proposed **2025** Plan Update will evaluate additional highways (shown in light blue)



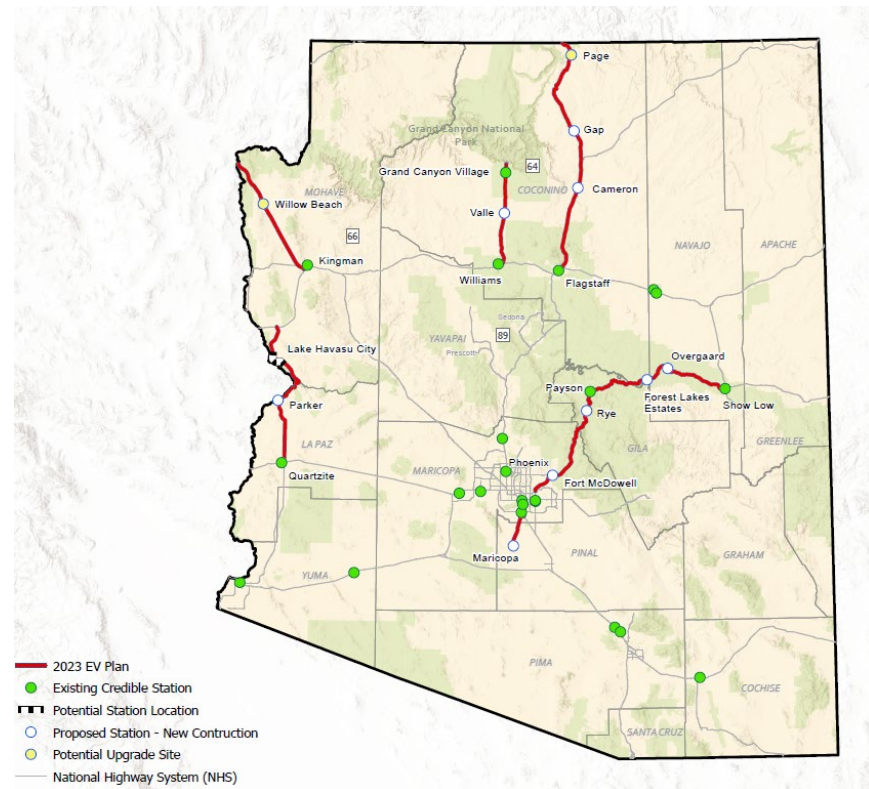
2022 EV Plan Implementation - Current Status

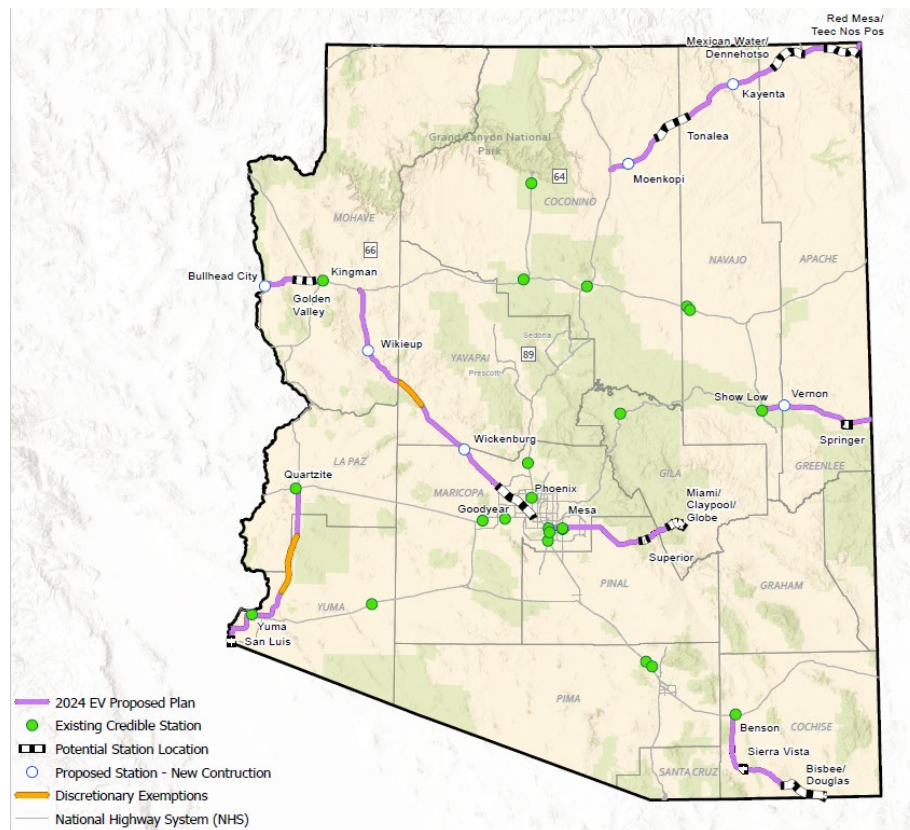

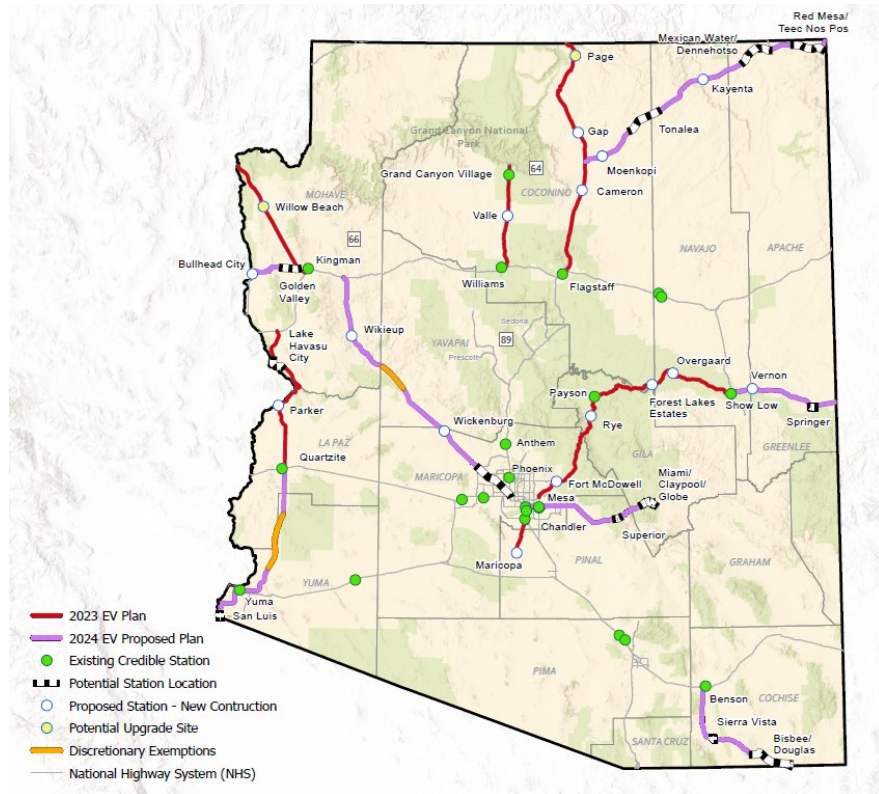

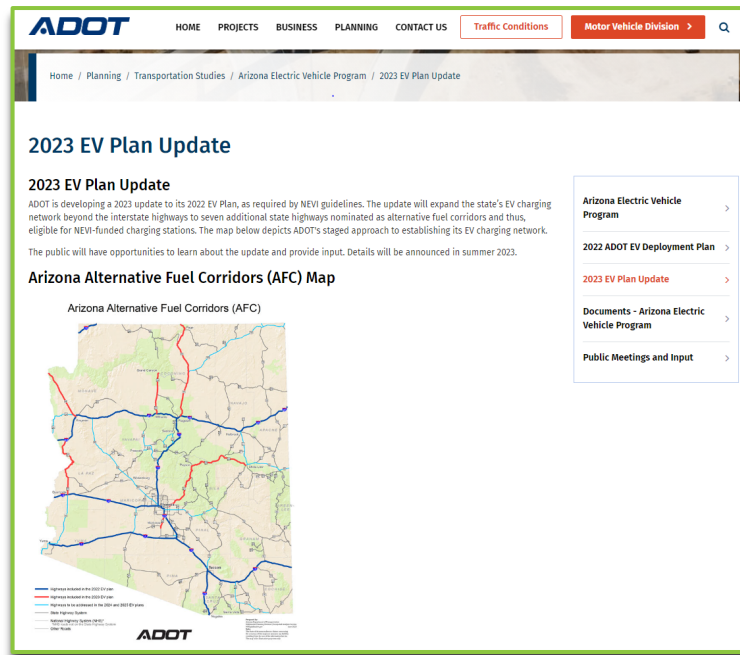

- **September 1:** Plan update due each year, 2023-2025
- **September 30:** Anticipated approval by the Federal Highway Administration of the updated this year's plan, 2024 Plan Update
- **Annually:** Staged approach to completing the charging network; additional highways addressed in plan updates, such as next year's 2025 Plan Update
- **Annually:** Contracts awarded to private entities to construct, operate, and maintain charging stations
- **Ongoing:** Station construction expected to begin within a year of each contract award

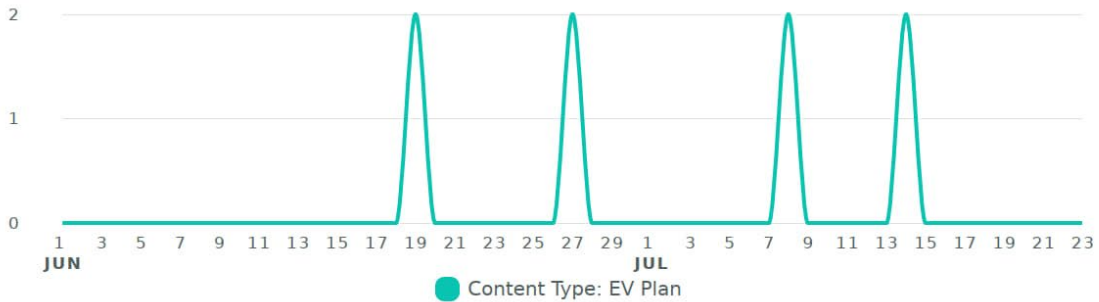

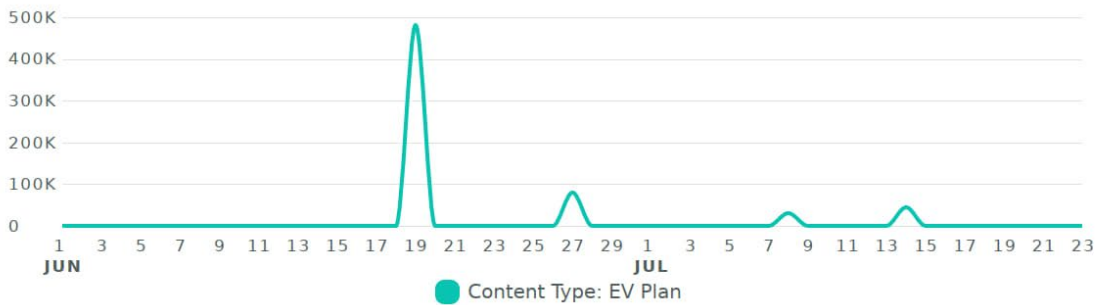

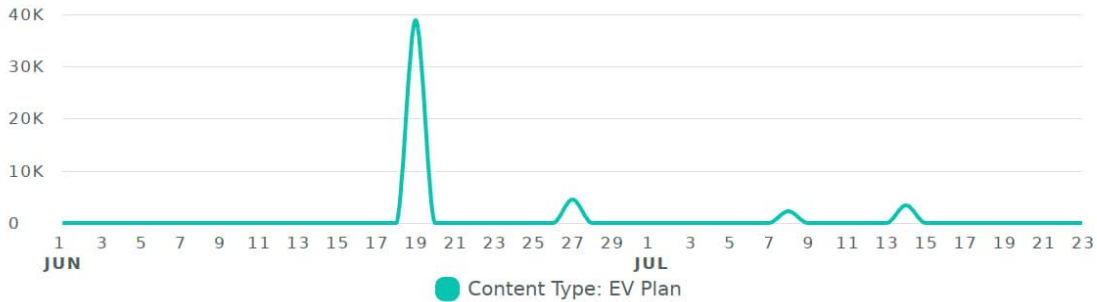

7/24/2024	<p>ABB E-mobility recommends that Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) allow both CCS and J3400 permanent connectors to be used, but not require a specific number or ratio of J3400 and CCS connectors at each DCFC site at this time. Rather, site owners should be allowed flexibility to determine the correct mix of J3400 and CCS connectors at their sites. Over the next decade, we expect robust demand for CCS connectors to continue for a number of reasons. Currently there are not enough CCS DCFC deployed to serve CCS EVs on the roads today. Second, the non-Tesla vehicle OEMs that have indicated an intention to transition to J3400 still have not deployed J3400 vehicles and deployment timelines are uncertain. Third, CCS vehicles will remain on the road for another decade or more and they will continue to need to charge.</p> <p>We discourage ADOT from requiring each DCFC charging port to include both connector types for several reasons.</p> <p>First, requiring both connectors per port could require significant redesign of DCFC products already on the market and planned to be introduced in the next year. Modifying products already on the market or in the later stages of development will incur significant research and development, product engineering, supply chain, and manufacturing costs.</p> <p>Second, an additional connector per port raises the costs of the final charging unit and NEVI site. 	<p>Third, requiring both connectors would likely slow DCFC deployments as products designed to meet the NEVI/CFI standards may need to be modified or re-engineered to accommodate two connectors per port. Changes to supply chains and manufacturing would likely follow.</p> <p>Here we provide two examples of how these concerns could manifest themselves based on existing, but generic, charging product designs. First, some chargers feature a single dispenser unit or charge post that has two ports and can dispense 150kW of power to two vehicles at the same time. In a typical NEVI site, a charging operator would only need to install two of these types of charging units as each unit has two ports. Requiring a one for one match of J3400 and CCS would mean that the charging operator would have to install four charging units instead of two. This could effectively double the hardware cost of a typical NEVI site. Further, it could increase development costs as more power may be needed at the site which could lead to longer interconnection queues, more real estate may be needed, and more civil construction work as well.</p> <p>In another example, some charging infrastructure designs have a single dedicated port per dispenser or charge post. Requiring that that charge post now add an additional connector could require redesigning the existing product which would have costly impacts on product engineering, supply chain, and manufacturing. While products are re-designed, the number of charging options available to the market would diminish and NEVI deployment would slow.</p>

	<p>Requiring too many J3400 connectors or too few CCS connectors could lead to stranded assets or underutilized chargers and investments. Meanwhile, there are already an insufficient number of high-power CCS ports to meet demand and CCS vehicles will still be produced over the coming years.</p> <p>Instead of mandating that each charging port have both connectors or setting a specific ratio of CCS to J3400 connectors, we encourage ADOT to allow charging owners and operators to choose which mix of connector types best meets the needs of the drivers they serve.</p>
