OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) are repairing the pavement on Interstate 10 between Salome Road (milepost 80) and Tonopah (milepost 90).

The work consists of removing the existing pavement surface and replacing it with new asphalt concrete and other related work.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- Milling the existing pavement and replacing it with new asphalt
- ▶ Replacing guardrail and guardrail end terminals
- ▶ Constructing drainage facilities
- Bridge repairs and replacement of concrete bridge barrier
- Replacing pavement markings, signage, and fencing

PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction is scheduled to begin in March 2025 and is expected to take 11 months to complete.


WHAT TO EXPECT

To minimize traffic impacts, milling and paving work is tentatively scheduled to occur from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. on weekdays.

Other related work will take place during the day, which will require lane restrictions.

ADOT will provide advance notice of restrictions and closures to email subscribers and on the project traffic alert web page.

Schedules are subject to change because of weather and other unforeseen situations.
