The request to use suballocated STBG funding on rural minor collector roadways will be on a "first come, first serve" basis.	The MPD Planning Section Manager will confirm that the project amount does not exceed the total upper limit of allowable STBG funding (15% of total suballocated STBG in single fiscal year, for <5K and 5K to 50K population bands).
