With over 240 personnel spread over 25 offices and a multi-million dollar operating budget, Central District functions within the greater Phoenix area, which is the 10th largest and fastest growing metropolitan area in the US. The District covers two counties, 26 incorporated communities - nine of which are among the 10 largest cities in Arizona - and encompasses roughly 5,500 lane-miles of state freeways and highways.

Central District plays a crucial role in the lifecycle of our infrastructure. Beginning in scoping, District construction staff assists in the development of upcoming projects and fully administers the construction oversight on behalf of the State. After construction is complete, District maintenance forces work hard to keep the State's infrastructure at the highest operational capacity.

Central District boasts an exemplary record foraccommodating special events like Super Bowls and NCAA Final Four events, all while having the highest traffic volumes in the State. Central District also plays a key role in handling all kinds of extreme weather. This ranges from plowing snow on SR-87 - in partnership with the North Central District - to dealing with the extreme heat and monsoon storms in the summer.
