



SR 86 Pavement Rehabilitation: Milepost 80-90

PROJECT FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation began a pavement rehabilitation project on State Route 86 from milepost 80 to milepost 90 in February 2025. This project is located within the Tohono O'odham Nation.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- Milling and repaving of the roadway surface;
- Replacing pavement markings,
- and other miscellaneous work.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction began in February 2025 and is expected to take approximately seven months to complete. Schedules are subject to change due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Traffic control devices are being used to move motorists through the construction area. Construction is scheduled from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. Crews are completing work in one direction at a time, one lane at a time. ADOT will continue to provide advance notice of restrictions and closures to email subscribers.
