




US 191: Table Top Road Pavement Rehabilitation

PROJECT FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation is completing a pavement rehabilitation project located in Greenlee County on US 191 between milepost 160 and 173 near the town of Clifton.



PROJECT SCHEDULE

- ▶ Construction began in July 2024 with guardrail replacement.
- ▶ Crews began paving in early 2025, starting from milepost 160.
- ▶ The project is expected to be completed by the end of August 2025.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ▶ A flagging operation will be utilized along some parts of US 191 within the construction area.
- ▶ Lane closures will be in place from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- ▶ Drivers should prepare for delays and allow for extra travel time.

ADOT will provide advance notice of restrictions and closures to email subscribers and on the project traffic alert web page.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- ▶ Applying a two-pass micro-surface on the existing asphalt
- ▶ Replacing pavement markings
- ▶ Implementing pavement spot repairs
