

Regulatory Roundup

As a reminder, Federal/State/Local (FSL) projects that receive state match grants from ADOT Aeronautics are subject to the same requirements as State and Local (SL) grants. ADOT remains a funding partner on these projects, and all standard state grant coordination and compliance requirements apply.

Sponsors must include ADOT Aeronautics throughout the project lifecycle, beginning early in the process. This includes coordination on consultant selection and contract development, required design reviews, construction-related approvals, and ongoing reporting.

Maintaining early and consistent communication with your assigned ADOT grant manager helps ensure projects remain compliant and move forward without delay.



2026 ADOT Airport of the Year

Airports of all sizes are encouraged to apply—what matters most is how your airport has made a positive impact within its operational context and community.

Call for Submissions

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) Aeronautics Group is excited to announce the upcoming 2026 Airport of the Year award—and we encourage all eligible Arizona public-use airports to consider applying.

For more than three decades, the Airport of the Year award has recognized airports that demonstrate excellence, innovation, and commitment to serving their communities and the aviation system as a whole. This recognition celebrates not just facilities, but the people and partnerships that make Arizona's airport system successful.

Submission Window

- Opens: January 12, 2026
- Closes: February 16, 2026

An email was sent to airport sponsors on January 12 with a link to the online application form.

Why Apply?

Winning Airport of the Year is a significant honor that:

- Highlights your airport's achievements statewide
- Recognizes the hard work of airport staff, sponsors, and partners
- Strengthens your airport's profile with stakeholders and the aviation community

More details, including the official application link, were shared in the January 12 email announcement. We encourage airports to gather examples and documentation that showcase their accomplishments from the past year, and apply. We look forward to reviewing your submissions and celebrating the outstanding work being done across Arizona's airport system.

Application Tips

To make the process easier, airports are encouraged to draft their responses in a Word or Google document and paste them into the online submission form. This allows teams to collaborate, gather supporting details, and ensure thoughtful, complete responses.

Evaluation Criteria

Applications will be evaluated based on demonstrated accomplishments, initiatives, and best practices in the following areas:

- Safety and Security
- Operations
- Environmental Sustainability
- Innovation and Technology
- Community Engagement
- Economic Impact
- Maintenance and Infrastructure

To help ensure broad participation and recognition, ADOT Aeronautics is formalizing an eligibility guideline for future awards. Beginning in 2027, airports that have received this award within the previous seven years will not be eligible to win again during that period. This guideline is being shared in advance so sponsors can plan future submissions accordingly. Airports that have won within the last seven years are still encouraged to apply for the 2026 award, as this guideline will not be applied until 2027.
