4. Project Location

Paul: The red circle on the map shows the project area. It is located at the traffic interchange in West Quartzsite near Milepost 17. This includes Quartzsite Boulevard between Dome Rock Road and Main Street, the I-10 on and off ramps at Quartzsite Boulevard, and the frontage roads of Dome Rock Road and Kuehn Street.

5. Project Purpose and Need

- Maintain access to existing development along the corridor

6. Project Visualization




Judah: We will begin with a visualization of the entire project before discussing key elements in greater detail. Please note, we are approaching the 60% design stage, so refinements will be made to what you see here as final design is completed.

7. Quartzsite Blvd Widening



Quartzsite Blvd Widening



Judah: As part of the planned improvements, The Town and ADOT are looking to widen Quartzsite Boulevard. The cross sections show two areas. The top section is between Main Street and the Westbound I-10 ramps, and the bottom section is between the Eastbound I-10 ramps and the Dome Rock Road/Kuehn Street frontage roads.

Both areas include a painted median in the middle, 12-foot through lanes, 6-foot shoulders, and 5-foot sidewalks.

For the area North of the I-10 Westbound on and off ramps to Main Street, we have a single northbound lane and right turn lane to Main Street and two southbound lanes with a right turn lane to the I-10 Westbound On ramp.


For the area south of the I-10 Eastbound on and off ramps to the Dome Rock Road and Kuehn Street intersection, we have two through lanes in each direction with dedicated right and left turn lanes for the I-10 Eastbound on and off ramps and a dedicated left turn lane to Kuehn Street.

8. New Bridge



New Bridge

- Two new through lanes in each direction
- Dual left turn lanes for NB Quartzsite Boulevard to WB I-10
- Single left turn lane for SB Quartzsite Boulevard to EB I-10
- 6' sidewalks on both sides of bridge with pedestrian fencing
- 16'-6" minimum clearance to I-10
- The new bridge will be constructed in multiple phases to maintain traffic



Judah: A significant improvement is a new bridge at Quartzsite Blvd. This new bridge will be much wider than the existing bridge, which will be removed as part of the project. The new bridge design includes:

- Two new through lanes in each direction
- Dual left turn lanes for Northbound Quartzsite Boulevard to Westbound I-10
- A single left turn lane for Southbound Quartzsite Boulevard to Eastbound I-10
- 6-foot sidewalks on both sides of bridge with pedestrian fencing
- A 16-foot-6-inch minimum clearance to I-10
- The new bridge will be constructed in multiple phases to maintain traffic

9. New Bridge Aesthetics

- Bridge aesthetics draw on the Town's rich history that includes Hi Jolly's work in the US Camel Corps and the abundant quartz deposits in the surrounding desert
- Aesthetics will be incorporated in bridge barriers, slope paving, and abutments
- The aesthetics take into consideration constructability and long-term maintenance

10. New Intersections – Quartzsite Blvd/Main St



Quartzsite Blvd/Main St



Judah: Now we want to show you some of the intersections our team is evaluating for planned improvements. This is the intersection of Quartzsite Blvd and Main Street.

- At Main Street we will match the existing intersection lane configuration before Quartzsite Boulevard is widened to the south and improves the existing traffic signals.

11. New Intersections – I-10/Quartzsite Blvd Ramps



I-10/Quartzsite Blvd Ramps



Judah: This rendering shows the I-10 ramps at Quartzsite Blvd.

- Both the Eastbound and Westbound ramp intersections provide pedestrian features including ADA ramps, striped crosswalks, and traffic signalization. The Westbound and Eastbound I-10 off ramps will be widened to three lanes at the intersection to accommodate dedicated left and right turn lanes in addition to another lane that allows for through, left, and right movements.
- The Westbound I-10 On ramp will be widened to include an additional lane at the intersection.

12. New Intersections – Dome Rock Rd/Kuehn St




Dome Rock Rd/Kuehn St



Judah: The last intersection is at Dome Rock Road and Kuehn Street.

- New traffic signals will be included at this intersection with pedestrian features that include ADA ramps and striped crosswalks
- Dome Rock Road will be widened at the intersection to add an additional left turn lane to Quartzsite Boulevard.
- Kuehn Street will be widened at the intersection to add an additional right turn lane to Quartzsite Boulevard
- South of Dome Rock Road/Kuehn Street intersection Quartzsite Boulevard will be widened to include an additional travel lane each direction

13. Anticipated Timeline



Judah: Here is the anticipated timeline for the project. We are currently in final design, we expect to start right-of-way acquisition in Q2, and finish right-of-way acquisitions in early 2027. A construction start date is based on funding availability. The Town is currently taking the lead in pursuing federal discretionary grants, with support from ADOT, for construction funding. The Town submitted a grant application on February 24, 2026, for the U.S. Department of Transportation’s Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development grant, known as the BUILD grant, and if successful will receive \$25M in funding for this project. Additional grants are being identified.

If construction funding does become available, we anticipate construction would start in early 2028 and go until the end of 2029. During construction, you can expect short-term impacts on traffic. To limit impact on the travelling public through the Town of Quartzsite, and to reduce the impacts to nearby businesses, one lane of traffic in each direction on Quartzsite Boulevard will be maintained. Access to businesses will be prioritized.

Some of the on- and off-ramps along I-10 will have limited closures required to facilitate ramp widening and construction of new intersections.

Constructing the new bridge will require temporary closures of I-10 to set new girders and remove the existing bridge. This work is typically limited to night work and temporary weekend closures, when necessary, where the existing ramps would be utilized as a detour.

The details of the potential traffic impacts will be further known as final design progresses. ADOT will provide advance notice of all construction restrictions and closures to the public.
