



Tunnel to I-17 Split

Interstate 10, Deck Park Tunnel to I-10/I-17 Split Study

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) is studying potential improvements to address traffic operations, safety and regional travel needs along Interstate 10 between the Deck Park Tunnel and the I-10/I-17 Split interchange. This corridor experiences heavy congestion and frequent crashes, and conditions are expected to worsen in the future without improvements. This study will expand on previous planning efforts and public outreach conducted by the Maricopa Association of Governments.

The study will prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) and Design Concept Report (DCR) to evaluate environmental and engineering considerations for improvement alternatives and ultimately select a preferred alternative. Design funding is currently programmed beginning in FY 2028.
