



Interstate 10, California/Arizona Border to Dome Rock Road Pavement Rehabilitation

PROJECT FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation is tentatively scheduled to begin a pavement rehabilitation project on Interstate 10, between the California/Arizona border and Dome Rock Road in La Paz County in late fall 2026.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- ▶ Milling and replacing the existing pavement with new pavement
- ▶ Extending pipe culverts
- ▶ Replacing guardrail and guardrail end terminals
- ▶ Replacing signage, pavement markings and other related work

PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin late fall 2026 and is expected to take one year to complete.

WHAT TO EXPECT

To minimize traffic impacts, milling and paving work is tentatively scheduled to occur from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m.** on weekdays. Other related work will take place during the day, which will require lane restrictions.

ADOT will provide advance notice of restrictions and closures to email subscribers and on the project traffic alert web page.

Schedules are subject to change because of weather and other unforeseen situations.
