



# Loop 101 and Interstate 10 System Interchange Improvements

## PROJECT FACT SHEET

### OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation, in partnership with the Maricopa Association of Governments, and in cooperation with the cities of Phoenix, Tolleson, Avondale, Goodyear and Glendale, will be constructing improvements to the Loop 101 and Interstate 10 system interchange. This project is included in the Regional Transportation Plan for Maricopa County and is funded through Prop 400, a countywide dedicated half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements approved by voters in 2004.

### PROJECT ELEMENTS

- ▶ A new high-occupancy vehicle (HOV) ramp within the existing interchange that will accommodate travel to/from the north along Loop 101 and to/from the east along I-10
- ▶ Widening of Loop 101 and I-10 to accommodate the new HOV ramp
- ▶ Adding an off-ramp to 91st Avenue from the existing southbound Loop 101 ramp to eastbound I-10, called a 'slip ramp'
- ▶ Extending the southbound Loop 101 off-ramp at McDowell Road
- ▶ Noise walls where warranted

### PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction is scheduled to begin in mid-May 2026 and is expected to take approximately three years to complete.

### WHAT TO EXPECT

Work will require lane restrictions and full closures of Loop 101, I-10, on- and off-ramps and cross streets in the area, primarily during overnight hours and weekends to minimize impacts to commuting traffic.

ADOT will provide advance notice of restrictions and closures to email subscribers and on the project web page.
