



County 15th Street and Avenue D

Intersection Improvement

PROJECT FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation in collaboration with the City of Somerton will begin a project to improve the intersection of County 15th Street and Avenue D within Yuma County beginning late July.

PROJECT ELEMENTS

- ▶ Install flashing beacons at the existing stop signs on County 15th Street
- ▶ Install rumble strips along County 15th Street
- ▶ Reconstruct and reconfigure driveways to properly tie into the new paved roadway surface
- ▶ Relocate mailboxes
- ▶ Relocate utilities within the project limits, as needed
- ▶ Remove, replace, and install new signage
- ▶ Install new striping and pavement markings
- ▶ Seed disturbed areas with native plant species, as needed
- ▶ Trim trees and vegetation
- ▶ Repair or relocate fencing associated with nearby properties
- ▶ Install temporary embedded advance warning signage during construction

PROJECT SCHEDULE

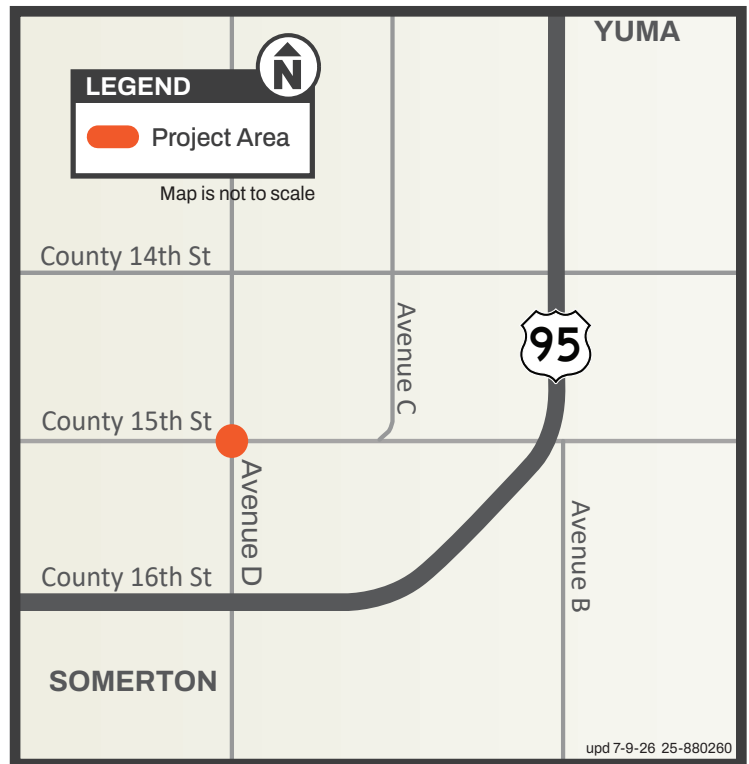
Construction is anticipated to begin late **September** 2026 and end early 2027.
