



I-10 Marana to Cortaro Roads

TRAFFIC CIRCULATION STUDY

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation is conducting a traffic circulation study along Interstate 10 in Marana. The objective of this study is to gather and analyze data to identify potential solutions for traffic conditions along Interstate 10 between Marana and Cortaro roads. The crossroads and interchanges within the study limits include:

- ▶ Marana Road
- ▶ Moore Road
- ▶ Tangerine Road
- ▶ Avra Valley Road
- ▶ Twin Peaks Road
- ▶ Cortaro Road

PROCESS

- ▶ Review findings from previous studies
- ▶ Collect and analyze data on current traffic conditions
- ▶ Develop potential solutions
- ▶ Conduct public outreach and obtain feedback
- ▶ Develop an environmental overview and other documentation
- ▶ Define a preferred alternative considering the projected inflation costs and expenditure
- ▶ Produce a final report

STUDY SCHEDULE

Spring 2026 Existing Conditions review and Environmental Analysis completed.

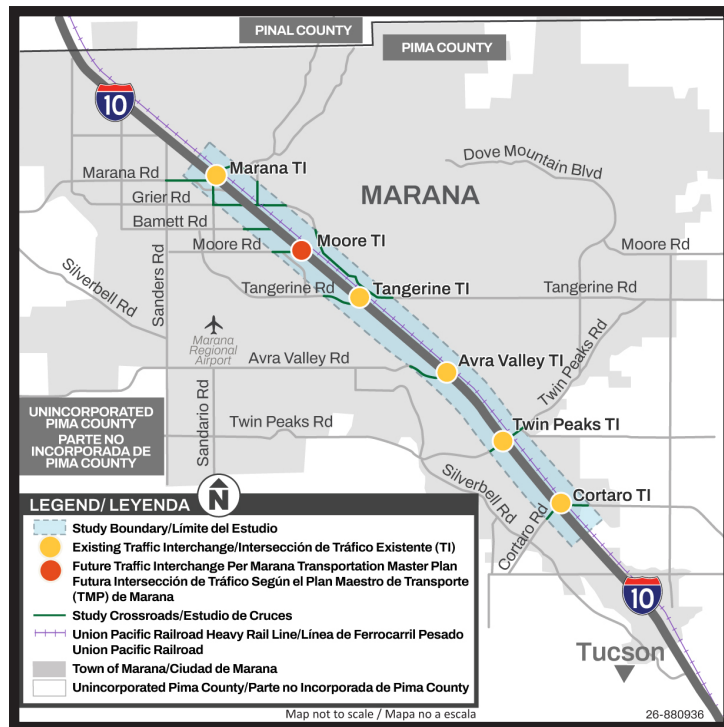
Summer 2026 Data analysis and potential solutions development in progress. Study website went live.

Fall 2026 Survey release to the public to gather feedback. Draft preferred alternatives.

Spring 2027 Draft report produced.

Summer 2027 Final report and 15% stage-level plans.
