## ADOT to Host Small & Disadvantaged Business Transportation Expo

The Arizona Department of Transportation and partner agencies will hold an event Thursday, March 12, highlighting project opportunities to owners of small businesses and companies qualifying for the agency's **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise** (DBE) program.

The 2020 DBE & Small Business Transportation Expo, scheduled for 7 a.m. to noon at Glendale Civic Center, also will allow attendees to network with industry professionals and business owners and hear from transportation leaders including featured speaker ADOT Director John Halikowski. Also participating are the Phoenix Public Transit and Street Transportation departments, Valley Metro, the Maricopa County Department of Transportation and Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. ADOT's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program helps qualifying small businesses compete for federally assisted contracts. The companies must be owned by individuals from socially and economically disadvantaged groups, including women and minorities.

## Final Environmental Assessment Issued for SR 30 Project

The **Arizona Department of Transportation** has completed the Environmental Assessment for **State Route 30** - a new east-west freeway located about 5 miles south of Interstate 10 in the Southwest Valley - with a **Finding of No Significant Impact** (FONSI). With this environmental clearance, ADOT can move forward with final design and construction when funding is identified and available.

The Final Location/Design Concept Report will be issued in the coming months.


SR 30, which would link Loop 303 with the Loop 202 South Mountain Freeway, has been identified in the **Maricopa Association of Governments' Regional Transportation Plan** since with early 2000s. It would serve as an alternate route to I-10, providing about 15 miles of new freeway passing through Goodyear, Avondale and Phoenix and portions of unincorporated Maricopa County.

#### **Study History**

• After several years of study, ADOT in 2015 presented the public with four SR 30 "build alternatives" which were evaluated with a comprehensive screening process that included engineering, environmental, cost, right-of-way and other factors. ADOT also considered the "no-build" alternative, which explored the impacts of not building the roadway and taking no action.

- In November 2017, ADOT hosted a public meeting to announce that one of the four alternatives – the Hybrid Alternative – was the recommended build alternative, and that it and the no-build alternative would be carried forward for further study and public input in the environmental study process.
- In May 2019, ADOT hosted the public hearing for the draft Environmental Assessment and Initial Location/Design Concept Report. Based on the results of the engineering and environmental studies for the SR 30 project, comments received on the draft Environmental Assessment and public input received at the public hearing and during the formal comment period, ADOT has approved the recommended build alternative evaluated in the draft Environmental Assessment – the Hybrid Alternative – as the selected alternative. The map below illustrates the Hybrid Alternative (formerly the recommended alternative and now the selected alternative for design and construction in the future when funding is identified).

With the completion of the final Environmental Assessment and issuance of a FONSI by ADOT, the requirements for this project under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) have been satisfied. For more information about SR 30 and the study, visit the web page at <u>azdot.gov/SR30</u>.

## AZ Officials Urge Congress to Provide Funding for I-11

Arizona elected officials and business leaders are voicing support this week for new legislation to advance the development of **Interstate 11**, a proposed highway route between northwestern Nevada and Arizona's southern border.

Interstate 11 Coalition executive director Scott Higginson, coalition chairman John Ragan, president David Martin and board member Glenn Hamer, president and CEO of the **Arizona Chamber of Commerce and Industry**, wrote a letter to members of the Arizona congressional delegation — Sens. Martha McSally and Kyrsten Sinema and Reps. Greg Stanton and Paul Gosar urging them to consider the bill to advance the I-11 project.

"The development of Interstate 11 is crucial to the economic viability of Arizona and Nevada, as well as the entire Intermountain West," the letter said. "Completion of Interstate 11 will enhance the commerce connectivity with Mexico and the growing industrial markets of both states." John Halikowski, director of the Arizona Department of Transportation, also wrote a letter to McSally.

Halikowski said the proposed legislation would recognize that current (Tier I) funding for I-11 should continue while additional financial and technical support will be required from **USDOT** to begin the **Tier II Environmental Review Process**, the next necessary step in making I-11 a reality.

"As you know, Arizona's growth has required us to innovate and use every resource available to provide the safest and most effective transportation system available," Halikowski said in his letter. "In order to ensure that Arizona does not lose resources for projects in the state's current transportation plan, it's critical that the financial assistance provided by the Secretary of Transportation not be reallocated from existing formula funding."
