





# State Route 89 at Road 1 North - Chino Valley Traffic Signal Project

## OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation in conjunction with the Federal Highway Administration is planning to improve transportation operations along the State Route 89 corridor in Chino Valley, Ariz., in Yavapai County. ADOT will construct new traffic signals with radar detection at the SR 89 and Road 1 North intersection.

Construction, which is tentatively scheduled to begin in the winter of 2020 with final project completion anticipated in the spring of 2021, includes the following work:

- Installation of traffic signals with radar detection on SR 89 and Road 1 North.
- Installation of a right-turn lane on northbound SR 89 to eastbound Road 1 North.
- Removing and replacing existing signage.
- Installation of curb/gutter and sidewalk.
- Upgrade sidewalk ramps at the four corners of the intersection to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements and striping for a crosswalk.

During construction, two-way traffic will be maintained at all times on SR 89. Access to all adjacent roads, trails and property will be maintained at all times. At times, there may be nighttime lane closures on SR 89.
