



US 60 & SR 260 Show Low Pavement Preservation Projects

OVERVIEW

Beginning May 2021, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) will begin construction of two pavement preservation projects on US 60 and State Route (SR) 260 in Show Low. These roadways serve as major corridors in Show Low and the surrounding areas and are some of the most-traveled corridors in the White Mountains region.

CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

The projects, which will be under construction at the same time, are scheduled during the construction seasons from spring through fall 2021 and 2022.

US 60: FH300 Apache Sitgreaves to 40th Street

Project limits: Between mileposts 336 and 342

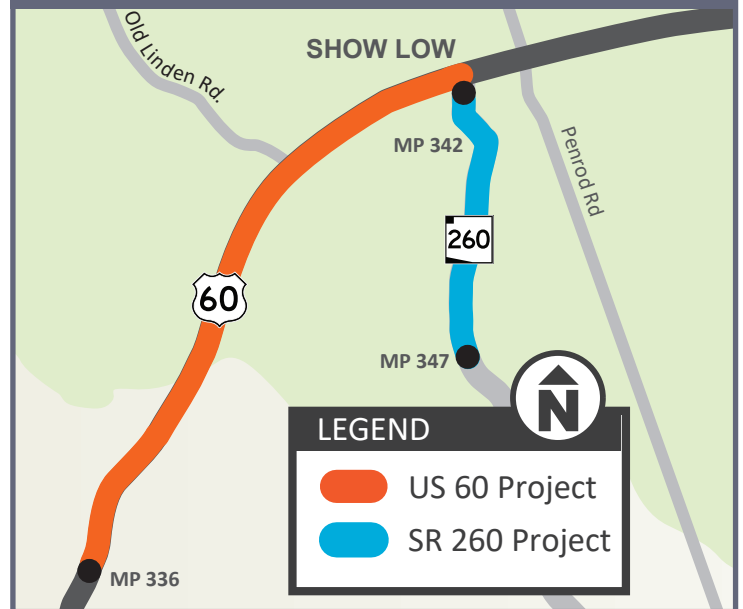
- ▶ Located in parts of Show Low, Fort Apache Indian Reservation and Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest.
- ▶ Remove/replace pavement on existing through lanes, turn lanes, shoulders and pullouts.
- ▶ Remove/replace pedestrian signals, sidewalks, curbs, and driveways to meet Americans with Disabilities Act standards.
- ▶ New curb/gutter and sidewalk, guardrail and pavement markings.

SR 260: US 60 to Knottingham Lane

Project Limits: Between mileposts 342 and 347

- ▶ Located between the junction with US 60 and just south of Knottingham Lane.
- ▶ Construct new right-turn lanes on all four corners at the intersections of Cub Lake Road and Show Low Lake Road.
- ▶ Remove/replace pavement on existing through lanes, turn lanes, shoulders and pullouts.
- ▶ Remove/replace pedestrian signals, sidewalks, curbs and driveways to meet Americans with Disabilities Act standards.
- ▶ Remove/replace guardrail and guardrail-end treatments, as needed.
- ▶ New curb/gutter and sidewalk, guardrail and pavement markings. Other related work (installing/relocating signage, pavement markers, etc.).

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ▶ Lane restrictions will not be in place during daytime hours or weekends.
- ▶ Business access will be maintained at all times during daytime and overnight construction work.
- ▶ Intermittent overnight east- and westbound lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. beginning Sunday evenings and continuing through Friday mornings.
- ▶ One travel lane will remain open in each direction during overnight work.
- ▶ Motorists should be prepared for delays when traveling through the area.
- ▶ The speed limit will be reduced in the work zones.

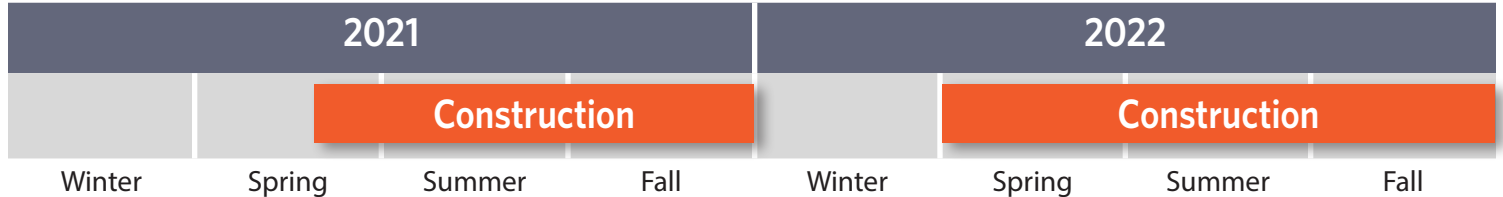


US 60 & SR 260 Show Low Pavement Preservation Projects

PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction is scheduled to begin in May 2021 and continue from spring through fall 2021 and 2022. The projects were awarded to the same contractor to minimize potential disruptions to the traveling public and the project schedule. More information will be posted on the project web page regarding the construction duration prior to the work starting.
