Project Purpose and Need

- Improve the deteriorating roadways and turn-lane surfaces by removing and replacing the existing pavement with new pavement.
 - The existing pavement is approaching its normal 20-year replacement life.
- Improve the safety of the roadway.
- Improve the ride for drivers.
- Increase accessibility for pedestrians.



Location of Projects





US 60: FH300 Apache Sitgreaves-40th St.

- Show Low, Fort Apache Indian Reservation and Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest.
- Remove/replace pavement.
- Remove/replace pedestrian signals, sidewalks and curbs.
- Remove/replace business, residential driveways that are not ADA compliant.
- New sidewalk = more than 38,500 sq. ft.





SR 260: US 60 to Knottingham Lane

- Located between south of the junction with US 60 and just south of Knottingham lane.
- Remove/replace pavement.
- New right-turn lanes on all four corners at the intersections of Cub Lake Road and Show Low Lake Road.





SR 260: US 60 to Knottingham Lane



- Remove/replace business & residential driveways that are not ADA compliant.
- Remove/replace pedestrian signals, sidewalks and curbs.
 - Replacing existing sidewalks: 7,760 sq. ft.
 - Installing new sidewalks: 3,350 sq. ft.



What to Expect

Projects will be constructed over two years: May through fall 2021 and, after winter shutdown, resume from spring through fall 2022.

- No lane restrictions during daytime hours.
- Business access will be maintained at all times during construction.



What to Expect

- Construction work hours will soon be established by the winning contractor, Sunland Asphalt and Concrete.
 - Expect to see crews working during the day and overnight.
- Lane closures will be <u>restricted</u> to the overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. beginning Sunday evenings and continuing through Friday mornings.
 - No weekend traffic restrictions.
- One travel lane will remain open in each direction during overnight work.
- Plan for delays up to 20 minutes while overnight restrictions are in place.
- Reduced speed limit in work zone.
