

Keeping Your business #AheadOfTheCurve During the I-10 Broadway Curve Improvement Project

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) companies looking to get involved in the I-10 Broadway Curve Improvement Project have had several opportunities to meet with the general contractor and find out what work will be available as the project is constructed over the next three years.

But making sure your employees and customers can get to your business is also vitally important. As the work begins, businesses of all types and sizes will need to know what to expect and how to get around the detours and other traffic restrictions needed in order to complete the \$776 million project.

Pre-construction activity began in late July with the removal of rubberized asphalt on I-10. This work is scheduled to continue along 11 miles of the freeway mainline between Loop 202 (Santan/South Mountain Freeway) and I-17 through September. This initial phase requires as many as six weekend closures of I-10 and two closures of US 60 between I-10 and Hardy Drive. Many other ramp and highway lane closures will be needed as the project continues, with completion scheduled in late 2024.

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To keep the community informed about the project and learn about available tools to help businesses navigate the challenges of major highway construction, the project developer, Broadway Curve Constructors (BCC) has created a website at <u>i10BroadwayCurve</u>. <u>com</u>. There you can find out what work is scheduled. Be sure to visit the Business Outreach page, where you'll find the "<u>What to Expect</u> <u>During Construction</u>" guide that provides information and links to more than a dozen local agencies and organizations dedicated to providing advice and assistance to local businesses.

To get project traffic information sent right to your smart phone download the free mobile phone app, "The Curve," available for both iPhone and Android. You can also get project information and traffic alerts sent to your email inbox by signing up on the website homepage. Scroll down to the lower right corner of the page and click on "<u>Subscribe for email updates</u>" and you'll have regular access to project construction and traffic updates, including detour routes, as soon as they become available. You can also connect to all of the Arizona Department of Transportation's social media sites which also provide information about I-10 Broadway Curve Project construction.

With all these tools available local companies should be able to keep their employees and customers well informed about construction and stay #AheadOfTheCurve.•

Queen Creek Unveils Automated Procurement Bid System

The Town of Queen Creek Procurement Division has partnered with ProcureNow and is excited to announce our transition from a modified paper-based bid solicitation process to a fully automated web-based electronic bidding and vendor management system.

To continue to receive bid notifications, uses will want to check the Purchasing home page on the <u>website</u> and the <u>new e-Procurement</u> Portal located there.

The new e-Procurement Portal will allow prospective Vendors and Suppliers the ability to:

• Register to receive notifications of future opportunities by signing up for the new e-Procurement Portal and selecting the "Subscribe" button to create an account.

• Follow along with updates to existing opportunities by finding the opportunity and clicking the "Follow" button. This will allow all interested bidders to receive amendments and addenda automatically.

• Submit questions and receive answers online regarding open bid opportunities.

• Use a guided process of responding electronically to bids to ensure your bids have been accurately completed.

• Receive timely support for bid questions.

• Have one location for all bid opportunities issued by the Town of Queen Creek.



There is no cost for vendors to register in ProcureNow.

ProcureNow will send users an email to activate their accounts. Users may subscribe to bids by navigating <u>here (Procurement</u> <u>Portal)</u> and clicking the "Subscribe" button. For more information about how to register, please see the <u>help file</u>.

Be Bold and Grow Your Company

6 Strategies for Long-term Business Success

Growing your business is necessary for longterm business stability. Even with excellent service, you can lose clients to the die-hard competition, new companies entering your space, or technology advancements. Longterm employees who have helped you build your reputation will retire, or they may decide to open their own company.

The business landscape continuously evolves, and successful entrepreneurs know they must keep their eyes on the horizon.

Accepting that growth is a necessary business strategy, what is your plan for the next 12 to 24 months?

According to Tom McMakin and Jacob Parks in *Never Say Sell*, there are six models for business growth. Study these models, and start planning your growth strategy.

- 1. More: Same work, same buyer. This type of growth is the most common, and it is slow and steady. Just do more of the same. Keep providing excellent customer service, and look for opportunities to take on more tasks.
- 2. Extend: Same work, different buyer. This is a good strategy when you have mastered your services or have an excellent product. Ask your satisfied client for referrals in their departments or companies, as well as introductions to their peers in similar organizations.

- 3. Expand: Different work, same buyer. This growth initiative opens the door to provide opportunities for staff in other departments or offices. This expansion scenario works well when your employees are aware of other services or product lines, and open the door for a colleague to introduce themselves.
- 4. Evolve. New work, same buyer. You may have been testing a new service or product, and this is an opportunity to pilot a program with a client who already trusts you. Be sure to stay on top of schedule, quality, and budget so you do not jeopardize a good client relationship.
- 5. Reach. Different work, different buyer. This type of growth strategy works well when you have a strategic teaming arrangement or when you have undergone a merger or acquisition. The type of work is not entirely new, and you have identified likely users. Your broad reputation and relationships contribute to your opportunity to develop this strategy.
- 6. Innovate. New work, different buyer. This is the most aggressive growth strategy. You have a service or product that you have never delivered with a buyer who does not know you. This strategy requires significant analysis and understanding of the known risks, and preparation to respond to risks that you have not anticipated.

Start thinking ahead

Dynamic companies always have a plan for long-term success. As you consider these six growth strategies, review your performance statistics, evaluate markets, review everchanging regulations, talk with employees, consider teaming opportunities, and be mindful about your capacity for investment. Asking these questions will kick-start planning for 2022 and beyond:

- Do you have the financial resources to invest in new technology or equipment?
- Are you prepared to hire a recognized expert for new services?
- What is your capacity to invest resources without an instant return? Are you prepared for a long-term strategy?
- Do you have strategic teaming partners who might be interesting in sharing costs and risks?
- What is your long-term business transition plan? Are you approaching an ownership transition and does one of the strategies work exceptionally well?
- Do you have employees who are interested in new career opportunities and are willing to take on new responsibilities?

Successful entrepreneurs always keep their eyes on the horizon because they know that the business landscape is ever-evolving. They know they must change or die. A good growth strategy is like money in the bank.•
