



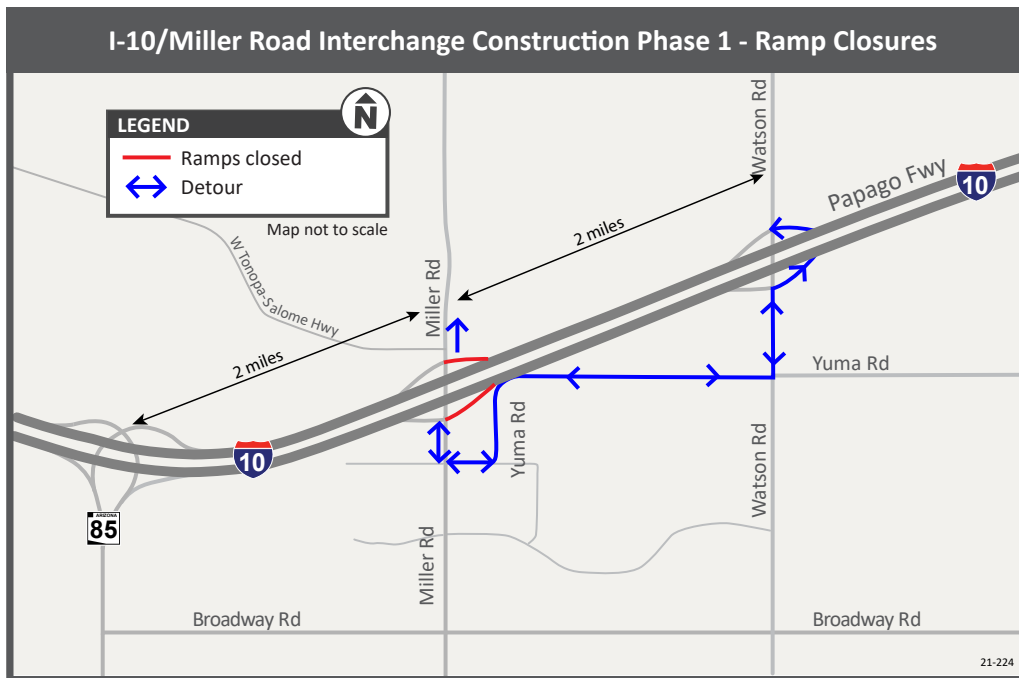
# I-10: State Route 85 to Verrado Way Improvements CONSTRUCTION NOTICE PHASE 1

## Phase 1 ramp closures at Miller Road begin Jan. 28, 2022

The Arizona Department of Transportation advises drivers to plan ahead for the first set of ramp closures at the Interstate 10/Miller Road interchange, which are scheduled to begin Friday, Jan. 28, and be closed through early March. The eastbound I-10 on-ramp and the westbound off-ramp at Miller Road will close as part of the first phase of work to reconstruct the interchange into a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI).

Following this closure, the westbound I-10 on-ramp and eastbound off-ramp will be closed for phase two of the interchange reconstruction. Miller Road will then be closed at I-10 for the third phase of reconstruction. ADOT will provide notice of these closures prior to construction.

- **Westbound I-10 Off-Ramp Detour:** Drivers can exit to southbound Watson Road and use westbound Yuma Road to access Miller Road.
- **Eastbound I-10 On-Ramp Detour:** Drivers can use eastbound Yuma Road to Watson Road to enter eastbound I-10.
