


### Revenue Report:

- GAS TAX Strong growth month (5.1%), strong growth FY 2022 (9.3%)
- DIESEL TAX Strong decline month (-7.5%), moderate growth FY 2022 (4.9%)
- VLT Moderate growth month (8.5%), strong decline FY 2022 (-4.2%)
- REGISTRATION Moderate growth month
   (6.4%), strong growth FY



## Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) formerly IIJA: Funding

- Updates since last month...
  - Suballocations: On March 14th, FHWA provided the Supplementary Tables identifying suballocations.
  - Sub-allocations identify the amount of funds that are required to be used on projects in certain areas, based on the areas' population.
  - On Tuesday, President Biden signed the budget, providing the funding for IIJA.



## Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) formerly IIJA: Funding

- What we <u>Don't</u> know...
  - FHWA will now begin the calculations for each states' funding level, aka Obligation Authority (OA).
  - Awaiting rules and guidance.
- When will we know more...
  - FHWA estimates having the funding calculations completed by the end of the month.
