


Revenue Report:

Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF)



- GAS TAX Strong growth month (8.8%), strong growth FY 2022 (9.9%)
- DIESEL TAX Moderate decline month (-1.4%), moderate growth FY 2022 (6.6%)
- VLT Strong decline month (-7.2%), strong decline FY 2022 (-5.7%)
- REGISTRATION Strong growth month (14.2%), strong growth FY 2022 (7.3%)



Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) formerly IIJA: Funding

- Updates since last month...
 - Continuing Resolution (CR) provides limited FFY2022 funding through... TODAY, and prohibits the new Carbon Reduction and PROTECT programs from starting.
 - Congress is anticipated to pass another CR, providing funding through March 11th.
 - On February 10th, FHWA issued guidance on the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program.
 - FFY2022 Apportionment levels for the NEVI Program = \$11.3M




Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) formerly IIJA: Funding

- What we <u>Don't</u> know...
 - Level of Obligation Authority (OA), aka, funding.
 - Amounts sub-allocated to the MPOs.
 - Project/Funding qualifications, awaiting rules and guidance.
- When will we know more...
 - When Congress passes a budget.
