

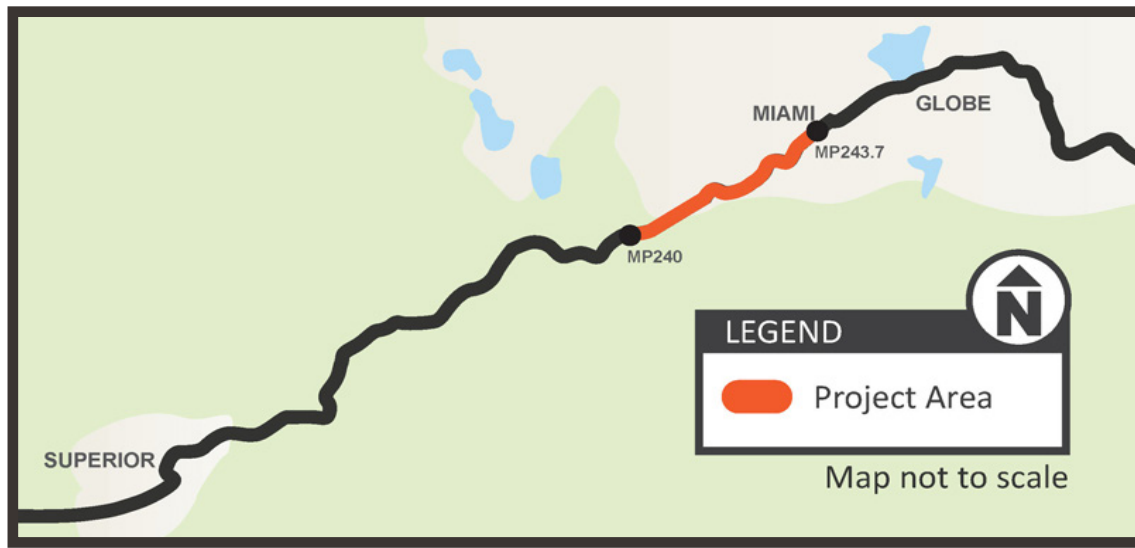


US 60, Copper Springs Canyon

PAVEMENT PRESERVATION

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation will complete a pavement preservation project on US 60 between mileposts 240 and 243.65 (just east of Pinto Valley Mine Road to approximately Reppy Avenue in Miami). Work is scheduled to begin mid-summer 2022 and will be completed in several phases to include: micromilling of the driving surface, spot repairs to the highway, installation of a chip seal treatment, microseal of the surface, and final striping. The entire project is expected to take about three months, but the most significant traffic restrictions will occur for approximately six weeks.



WHAT TO EXPECT

Flaggers and pilot cars will control traffic during working hours. Motorists should expect delays of approximately 15 minutes in each direction. The road will be open to traffic in both directions outside of the scheduled working hours.

In addition, intermittent parking restrictions will be required on the west end of Miami. Vehicles must be cleared from ADOT right-of-way during construction hours from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays, and Fridays from 6 a.m. to noon, beginning Tuesday, Aug. 9, and ending Friday, Sept. 23.
