ADOT Seeks DBE Goals & Availability Study Input

The **Arizona Department of Transportation** is seeking public input for its **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise** program as it updates its overall goals for this effort.

ADOT and agencies receiving funds through ADOT award contracts each month for transportation projects throughout the state. As a requirement of receiving U.S. Department of Transportation funds, ADOT must operate the Federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.

ADOT is required to set three-year overall goals for DBE participation in **USDOT**-funded contracts. ADOT has developed new overall DBE goals and is seeking public input.

FHWA-funded Contracts

ADOT is proposing an overall DBE goal for **Federal Highway Administration** funded contracts of 12.55% for fiscal year 2024 through 2026, which updates its current goal of 12.89%. In recent years, ADOT has achieved DBE participation very close to this goal.

Based on relative availability of DBEs for these contracts and other factors, ADOT also projects that it will not be able to achieve all of this goal solely through race-and gender-neutral means (ADOT small business programs and other efforts) and that a portion will need to be achieved through continued use of DBE contract goals. ADOT proposes to achieve the overall DBE goal of 12.55% with 7.65% to be achieved through race- and gender-conscious means and 4.90% to be achieved through race- and gender-neutral means. A new overall DBE goal must go into effect on Oct. 1, 2023.

FAA-funded Contracts

ADOT is proposing an overall DBE goal for **Federal Aviation Administration** funded contracts of 9.72% for fiscal year 2025 through 2027, which updates its current goal of 10.69%. ADOT proposes to continue to meet all of these overall DBE goal through race- and gender-neutral means and does not plan to use DBE contract goals for these contracts. A new overall DBE goal must go into effect on Oct. 1, 2024.

FTA-funded Contracts

ADOT is proposing an overall DBE goal for **Federal Transit Administration** funded contracts of 9.85% for fiscal year 2025 through 2027, which updates its current goal of 14.51%. ADOT proposes to continue to meet all of these overall DBE goal through race- and gender-neutral means and does not plan to use DBE contract goals for any of these contracts. A new overall DBE goal must go into effect on Oct. 1, 2024.

Public Comments

ADOT is seeking comments on its proposed overall DBE goals and the recently completed draft **2022 Availability Study Report** that provides information regarding these goals. **Keen Independent Research**, which conducted **ADOT's 2020 Disparity Study**, prepared the 2022 Availability Study. The public is encouraged to comment on the size of the proposed overall DBE goals, the methodology used to develop the goals, the results of the 2022 Availability Study, as well

as suggestions on how to improve contracting opportunities for DBEs and other small businesses, including what ADOT and the industry can do to enhance support of the Federal DBE Program.

All documents related to the proposed goal and methodology and draft availability study will be available for review <u>here</u>. At any time during the public comment period, comments can also be provided in the following ways:

How to make the most of holiday social events

If it has not started already, your social calendar is about to fill up with holiday lunches, open houses, and crowded mixers. 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One Casa Grande Ballot Request Approved

While three of the four municipal project requests put before Casa Grande voters in the general election failed, Mayor Craig McFarland has expressed his gratitude that a \$51 million street and transit request passed.

Voters denied requests for upgrades to two parks and a public safety request for new fire stations and supporting equipment. The transportation request passed by just 246 votes.

Monies from the transportation bond will go to expand **Fifth Street**, **Trekell Road** from Rodeo to Val Vista and **McCartney Road** from Pinal to Interstate 10, according to McFarland.

He said the length of the ballot and number of questions — along with the state of the economy and cost of living concerns — may have contributed to the other questions' defeats.

McFarland said Casa Grande will progress with building **Fire Station 503** and upgrading stations **501** and **502**. He noted the timelines will be longer than originally hoped now that the ballot measure has failed. (<u>Source</u>)



October Input Prices Slightly Higher

Construction input prices increased 0.3% in October compared to the previous month, according to an Associated Builders and Contractors analysis of U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Producer Price Index data. Nonresidential construction input prices increased 0.2% for the month.

Construction input prices are up 14.6% from a year ago, while nonresidential construction input prices are 14.2% higher. On a monthly basis, input prices were up in only three of 11 subcategories. Natural gas experienced the largest decline in prices, falling 37.8% in October. Crude petroleum prices increased 2.0%, while unprocessed energy materials prices were down 19.8%.

"Construction input prices inched higher in October, but that was largely due to an

increase in petroleum prices," said ABC chief economist Anirban Basu. "Certain categories, like steel mill products and iron and steel, experienced sharp price declines for the month. This is a welcome development for contractors, as just 31% expect profit margins to rise over the next six months, according to Associated Builders and Contractors' Construction Confidence Index.

"For weeks, the conventional notion has been that peak inflation is behind us," said Basu. "Today's **PPI** report supports this and gives credence to the idea that the **Federal Reserve** will soon slow interest rate increases. But contractors should take a wait-and-see approach, at least until we have multiple months of data suggesting that peak inflation has in fact been achieved." (Source)
